

Horseradish Glaze: 2 cups pure maple 1/2 cup

prepared horseradish, drained - 2 heaping tbsp Dijon mustard - 1 tbsp ancho chili powder - Salt and freshly ground pepper

Ribs: 1/3 c Spanish paprika - 3 tbsp ancho chili powder - 3 tbsp New Mexican chili powder - 2 tbsp ground coriander - 1 tbsp ground cumin - 2 tbsp kosher salt - 2 tsp ground black pepper = 3 cups wood chips (hickory, mesquite, or applewood) - 4 racks pork ribs (3 pounds each) Whisk all ingredients together in a medium bowl. Season with salt and pepper, to taste.

Ribs:

- 1. Stir spices together in a medium bowl.
- 2. About 1/2 hour before cooking time, soak hickory chips in enough water to cover. Drain chips. In a covered grill, place slow burning charcoal in both sides of a drip pan. Sprinkle coals with wood chips.
- 3. Rub top side of each rack of ribs with about 3 tablespoons of the rub. Place ribs, bone side down, on grill. Close cover or place cover on the smoker. Grill about 1 1/2 hours, adding chips every 20 minutes. During the last 10 minutes of grilling, brush liberally with the Maple-Horseradish Glaze. WATCH



Please call the number on your letter to let us know if you are interested in participating or not.

PFAS chemicals were found in drinking water in **New Castle County, Delaware near New Castle Air National Guard Base**. They are no longer found at levels above the EPA health advisory. The Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR) is offering free, voluntary blood and urine testing for PFAS to a random selection of households who had PFAS in their drinking water.

If your household is selected, you will receive a letter in the mail. Please call the number on the letter. If we do not hear from you, we will call you or visit your house if we cannot reach you by phone.

This exposure assessment will help participants and their community better understand their exposure to PFAS.

Delaware Street UPDATE


Many agree with Mayor Quaranta's support for keeping the Delaware Street renovation simple.

No bump outs, no widening.

Dave Athey, City Engineer. presented the slide show on street redesign... did not present as well as he could have. To questions from Council, he must have said a half dozen times that he should have clarified his previous point. One shop owner rhetorically wondered about how much was spent on this study. It would have been so much cheaper for that person to just take the time to sit in front of any shop/ business for a week and observe the truck deliveries, the uneventful crossings of our square by pedestrians and the oh so frequent ignoring of the stop sign here by motorists. One shop owner made the point that a bump out, green or otherwise, planned for in front of the Terry House would complicate the already contorted gymnastics of multiple delivery trucks and present more dangers as vehicles try to pass them on the way to and from the wharf.

In the end,Council appears to have decided against widening Delaware Street from 2nd to the what. Bump outs are out or almost except for that green area at Terry and paving might even be afforded on Delaware up to 4th Street.

But there will be an additional Council meeting tomorrow Mon. Sept 16th at 6 pm to continue the discussion.
