4 med. carrots, cut in half lengthwise, then diagonally into 1-inch pieces = 3 medium Yukon gold potatoes,

each cut into 6 pieces 1 medium red onion, cut into thin wedges 1 tsp salt 1/2 tsp pepper 4 bonein skin-on chicken thighs ■2 tsps olive oil ■3 tbsps balsamic vinegar 2 tbsps honey 3 fresh thyme sprigs

EASY STEPS ARE...

- Spray 5-quart slow cooker with cooking spray. Place carrots, potatoes and onion in slow cooker. Season with 1/2 tsp of the salt and 1/4 tsp of the pepper.
- Season chicken thighs with remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 tsp pepper. In 10-inch skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Place chicken skin side down in skillet. Cook chicken 3 to 5 minutes, turning once, until browned on both sides. Transfer chicken to slow cooker.
- In small bowl, beat balsamic vinegar and honey with whisk. Pour over chicken in slow cooker. Place thyme sprigs around chicken. Cover; cook on High heat setting 3 1/2 to 4 hours or until juice of chicken is clear when thickest part is cut to bone (at least 165°F) and vegetables are tender.
- Remove thyme sprigs, and transfer chicken and vegetables to serving platter; cover and keep warm. Pour cooking liquid into 1-quart saucepan. Cook over mediumhigh heat 10 to 13 minutes or until the liquid is slightly thickened and reduced to about half. Drizzle over chicken and vegetables, and serve.
