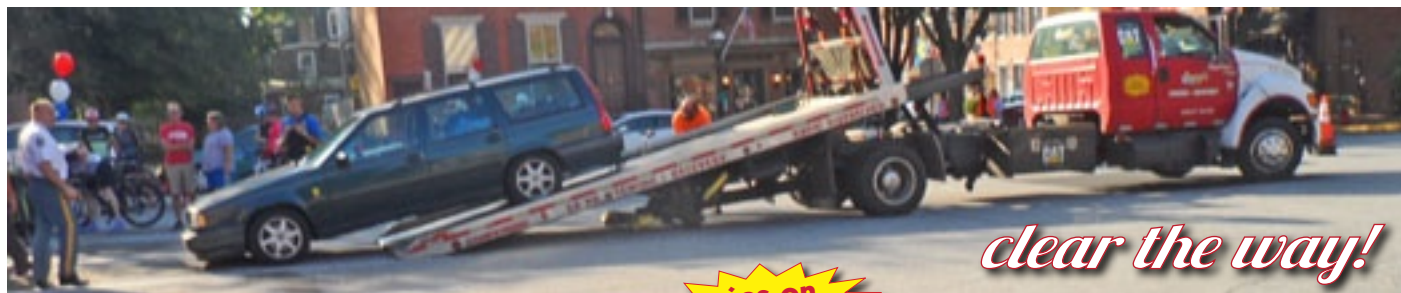

**24** The first factory-built became affectionately known as the **Tin Lizzie**. 1928, The first all-instrument flight took place in New York when **Lt. James H. Doolittle** guided a Consolidated NY2 Biplane over Mitchell Field. 1929, **Brooklyn Dodgers** played their last game at **Ebbets Field**. 1957

**25** The first **US Congress** adopted 12 amendments (10 became the Bill of Rights) to the Constitution. 1789, The **Sequoia National Park** was established in Central California. 1890, **Henry Ford** announces the 8 hour, 5-day work week. 1926, **Kate Smith** debuted an hourlong show, with her theme song, **When the Moon Comes Over the Mountain**. 1950, **Phillies** beat **Reds** 7-1, ending 16 consecutive Sunday losses. 1960, 3 crewmen of **Skylab II** landed in the Pacific after being on the space laboratory for 59 days. 1973, **Sandra Day O'Connor** became the first female Supreme Court Justice. 1981

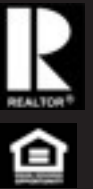

# Welcome rescued dogs



## Irma orphans

The **Brandywine Valley SPCA** welcomed 18 dogs from parts of Florida  
impacted by Hurricane Irma. The airlift was organized by the Humane  
Society of the United States (HSUS) and is being flown by Wings of  
Rescue, with funding from [GreaterGood.org](#) in partnership with  
[FreeKibble.com](#).

An emergency airlift of more than 100 animals from parts of Florida  
impacted by Hurricane Irma will deliver 18 dogs to the BVSPCA. The dogs  
come from Manatee County and Hillsborough County, where animals  
rescued during and after Hurricane Irma have exceeded the capacity of  
local shelters. The airlifted animals were in the shelters prior to the  
hurricane, and moving them to northern locations gives rescued pets  
more time to stay local and hopefully be reunited with their families. The  
18 dogs will be driven from the airport to the BVSPCA's New Castle and  
Georgetown Campuses. The dogs will be medically assessed, spayed/  
neutered as needed, and made available for adoption.

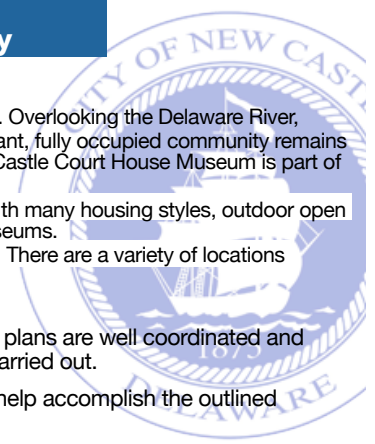
