

Welcome rescued dogs



The **Brandywine Valley SPCA** welcomed 18 dogs from parts of Florida impacted by Hurricane Irma. The airlift was organized by the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) and is being flown by Wings of Rescue, with funding from GreaterGood.org in partnership with Freekibble.com.

An emergency airlift of more than 100 animals from parts of Florida impacted by Hurricane Irma will deliver 18 dogs to the BVSPCA. The dogs come from Manatee County and Hillsborough County, where animals rescued during and after Hurricane Irma have exceeded the capacity of local shelters. The airlifted animals were in the shelters prior to the hurricane, and moving them to northern locations gives rescued pets more time to stay local and hopefully be reunited with their families. The 18 dogs will be driven from the airport to the BVSPCA's New Castle and Georgetown Campuses. The dogs will be medically assessed, spayed/neutered as needed, and made available for adoption.


