The City of New Castle, Delaware City and the Historic New Castle Alliance will be hosting a bicycle ride and festival this **Saturday, October 5th from noon-5pm.** Major event sponsors are Delaware City Refinery, Savage Services and Norfolk Southern. The one-day event is the first joint festival

**Market Street** will be closed; no parking without event permit.

**Delaware Street** closed to parking and traffic from 4<sup>th</sup> Street to Wharf (incoming traffic can exit on 3<sup>rd</sup> street at Delaware but no traffic comes into town on Delaware St. beyond 4<sup>th</sup> Street) W. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street between Delaware and South Sts. closed to parking and traffic (traffic flow will be reversed for bicyclers)

No parking on right side (church side) of W. 5<sup>th</sup> Street between Delaware St. and South St.

**NO PARKING** on Green side of E. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street from Harmony St. to Delaware St. except for vendor parking; event-parking permit required.

**Local Traffic/parking** only on The Strand and 2<sup>nd</sup> Streets between Harmony and Delaware streets

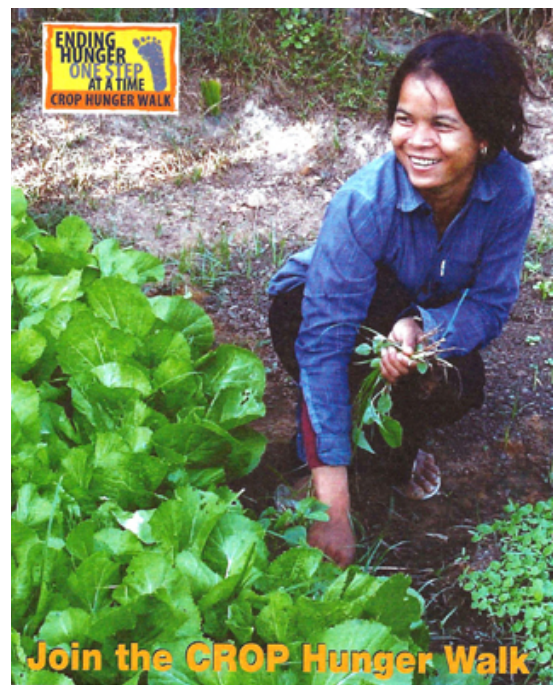
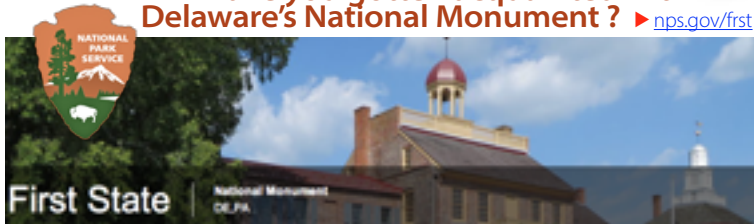

**RIVER TOWNS** *Ride & Festiveal* will feature riders cycling between the two destinations on the bike-friendly, 10-mile corridor of Route 9 that connects the towns. Competitive cyclists will be encouraged to participate in the River Towns Time Trial Race for cash and prizes while recreational cyclists can pick their distance and ride for fun or to earn a distance medal starting at noon (20, 40 or 60 miles for 1-3 round trips). The event will be held rain or shine. Event and bicycler registration information can be obtained at [www.rivertownsfestival.com](http://www.rivertownsfestival.com). While the official start location for recreational riders is Delaware City, New Castle bicycle riders who register and want to earn medals can also receive a number and start from Town Hall beginning around noon. All children under age 16, who complete 10 miles between the two cities, win a ribbon.

While cyclists traverse between the two towns, festivals will be held in each town's main square: The Green in Historic New Castle and Battery Park in Historic Delaware City.

FREE family-friendly activities in New Castle on the Green include live music stage; kids bicycle rodeo (bring your bicycle!); bicycle safety information; hay rides; face painting; inflatable castle, obstacle course and moon bounce; colonial games and toys sponsored by the George Read II House; Arasapha Garden Club fall plant sale, vendors and free pumpkin decorating. Businesses will have decorated or carved pumpkins in front of their establishments and visitors will vote for their favorite ones. Volunteers are needed for the information desk and other areas; please sign up online at [www.rivertownsfestival.com](http://www.rivertownsfestival.com).

A highlight of the event will be a craft beer festival held at Battery Park in Delaware City from 1-5pm. More than a dozen craft breweries will be participating. Those same craft beers will also be available at the restaurants located in Historic New Castle.

Admission is free. Free shuttles will transport those wanting to enjoy the activities in the both towns. A SAG support van will be provided for bicyclers. Food and drink are available for purchase.

The event is being organized by Event Allies, the firm that organizes the Wilmington Grand Prix bike race/event, in conjunction with bicycling professionals. We have time trials between the two cities starting at 11am from the Trustee Town Hall arch. General

# TRUSTEES ELECTION

The **Trustees of the New Castle Common** have formally declared a vacancy on their 13-member board. The Board has scheduled an election for **Saturday, October 19, 2013**.

Life member Richard M. Appleby, Jr., resigned on February 26 when he moved out of the City of New Castle. To our great sorrow, Dick passed away on April 18.

**The Trustees were established by the Penn family in 1764, prior to the existence of the U.S. As such, by Charter the Trust keeps its own voter list, and residents of New Castle must be registered in order to run for or vote in a Trustee election. Voters must be at least 18 years of age on or before the date of the election, and have resided in New Castle for at least one year.**

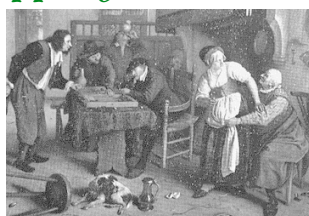

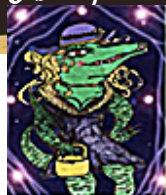
