A Sloppy Joes recipe starts with refrigerated biscuits pressed in muffin cups and filled with **Manwich** meat mixture, then sprinkled with cheese after baking

Ingredients

- 1 pound ground chuck beef (80% lean)
- 1/2 cup chopped yellow onion

ingredients

- 3 Parts Gin
- 1 Part Dry Vermouth
- 1 Part Orange Juice
- 1 Part Vermouth, Sweet
- 1 Dash Pastis
- 1 Quarter Orange

Fill a shaker with ice cubes. Add all ingredients. Shake and strain into a chilled cocktail glass. Garnish with orange.






