Ingredients

8 lasagna noodles, uncooked 14 oz freshly shredded, low-moisture part skim Mozzarella cheese, divided 3/4 c Ricotta cheese • 1 large egg white • 1/3 c freshly, finely shredded Parmesan cheese • about 1¼ oz freshly ground black pepper • 3 - 4 medium Roma tomatoes, thinly sliced 1/4 c chopped fresh basil, plus more for garnish • 1 c marinara sauce.. (buy a jar at the supermarket)

Directions

Crank the oven up to 350°. Cook pasta according to directions listed on package to al dente. Drain pasta (*DO NOT rinse with water*) and align lasagna noodles in a single layer on a large sheet of parchment or wax paper. For filling, in a large mixing bowl, whisk together ricotta cheese and egg white until well blended. Stir in Parmesan. Mix in 12 oz. of the Mozzarella cheese and season with black pepper to taste.

(I wouldn't recommend seasoning with salt just because the cheeses already have plenty of salt).

Place 1/4 c of the cheese mixture over each lasagna noodle and spread into an even layer, going from one end of the lasagna to the other. Align 4 thin tomato slices over cheese mixture then sprinkle fresh basil over top. *Snugly* roll lasagna noodles to opposite end. Spread about 1/4 c pasta sauce in the bottom of an 11 x 7 inch baking dish. Align lasagna roll ups, seam side down in dish. Top each roll up with about 2 tbsp of the pasta sauce (*covering edges of pasta so they don't dry out while baking*).

Sprinkle top with remaining 2 oz. shredded Mozzarella. Bake in preheated oven 30 minutes. Remove from oven, plate pasta and garnish with plenty of basil ribbons. Serve warm.

SHORTCUTS AT RIVERBEND Net developer indictments

The much discussed and controversial "55+ community" south of town is in the news again. From dispatches...

The U.S. Attorney of the District of Delaware, David C. Weiss, announced that Middletown developer Joseph L. Capano, 73, was indicted with three counts of making false statements to federal authorities and charging Capano and Riverbend Community LLC, a Delaware Corporation, with conspiracy to violate the Clean Water Act.

According to the U.S. Attorney's office, Capano and Riverbend Community LLC conspired with others to discharge pollutants into wetlands subject to federal jurisdiction without a permit, during development of Riverbend at Old New Castle, a residential development located just south of Dobbinsville on Rt 9.

The "Construction activities in wetland areas have the potential to pollute our waters and damage our environment. Before developers perform work in wetland areas, they must first seek a permit from the Army Corps of Engineers. When interacting with formal regulators regarding activities in wetland areas, developers must accurately describe the nature of their activities. Those who fail to do so proceed at their peril." said Acting United States Attorney David C. Weiss.

"Wetlands play a critical role in maintaining a healthy environment," said David G. McLeod, Jr., Special Agent in Charge of EPAs criminal enforcement program in the Middle Atlantic States. "Once gone, it's rare to see wetlands fully restored. EPA and its law enforcement partners are working to protect these invaluable natural assets as well as the communities around them." The indictment focuses on earthmoving, construction and excavation activities that Capano, on behalf of Riverbend Community LLC, directed employees and contractors to perform on the entrance road to the development, known as the causeway. 
