

An excellent summary of the recent City Council meeting,
not an official record of the meeting, by
Councilperson Suzanne Souder.



"After a presentation from City Engineer Dave Athey and many questions, Council voted unanimously to authorize City Administrator Bill Barthel, Building Official Jeff Bergstrom, and Mr. Athey to negotiate the details of a contract with Cirillo Brothers to repave Delaware Street from The Strand to 5th Street with granite curbs and painted crosswalks. Cirillo Brothers submitted the lower of the two bids received for this project. They have done several other projects for the City which has found them to be reliable. The estimated cost for this is \$1.6 million, within our budget and including a 10% contingency for unpredictable additional costs. We have \$1.78 million for street infrastructure work but \$100,000 of that is required for relining our sewer pipes. This will enable some work to begin this winter with the hope that the entire project will be completed before Separation Day 2020. I had suggested to Linda Ratchford and Bill Barthel that HAC architect Leila Hamroun be invited to this meeting to give her professional opinion of the project. She could not be present as she was attending a professional conference in Virginia. She did send a letter outlining her thinking regarding the materials to be used for the crosswalks. Mrs. Ratchford read this letter in which Ms Hamroun recommends two-dimensional, reversible crosswalks. She noted that crosswalks are a 20th-century feature. She concluded that standard painted crosswalks were appropriate but that "faux historic paving materials to make the crosswalk look 'old' within new asphalt paving" is not appropriate.

After much discussion Council decided to eliminate repaving Delaware Street between The Strand and the Wharf from this project. While needing work, that section of Delaware St. is in at least as good condition as the sections approved for this project. Some portions of Delaware included in the project are in worse condition. The curbs below The Strand are in better condition than those on most of the rest of Delaware Street. *continued on page 5*

Though these finished bloomin' apples look insane, they're actually quite easy to make. Because apples can turn brown really quickly, you'll want to brush them with butter and get them in the oven pretty quickly after slicing them. If you want to take your time, squeeze lemon juice all over the cut side to prevent browning.

INGREDIENTS

Cooking spray - 4 tbsp. melted butter - 1 tbsp. packed brown sugar - 1 tbsp. granulated sugar - 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon - 4 apples - 8 chewy caramel squares - Breyer's Natural Vanilla ice cream, for serving - Caramel, for drizzling

DIRECTIONS

1. Oven happy at 375° and grease a medium baking dish with cooking spray. In a small bowl, whisk together butter, sugars, and cinnamon.
2. Slice top off of each apple then use a melon baller (or a teaspoon) to scoop out core. Using a paring knife, make two circular cuts in apple. Place apple cut side down on a cutting board and slice crosswise, being careful not to cut through the core.
3. Place cut apples in a small baking dish. Fill each apple with two caramel squares, then brush melted butter mixture on top. Bake until the apples are tender, about 30 minutes.

DELAWARE STREET *continued*

There are several issues to be determined about the area around the Wharf. Should we add parking spaces in this area? Should we install the sewer and water lines to support the possible construction of a public restroom with shower facilities for visiting crews of tall ships? If we decide to do either or both, it makes sense, both economically and to minimize disruption, to complete them in conjunction with repaving that section of Delaware Street. At least one Council member expressed the hope that we will revisit dealing with this area next year.

The extension of the brick area in front of the Old Town Hall by about 3 feet is currently included in this project. Some feel this would make for a safer crossing of 2nd Street and also improve the crossing of Delaware Street in front of Old Town Hall. Mr. Athey said this is a relatively small portion of the cost of the project.

DELDOT will be replacing the traffic light at 6th and Delaware next summer which may involve some digging in the area so it doesn't make sense to repave it now. The area of Delaware and Ferry Cut-Off is also under review for possible changes so repaving there at this point is not advisable." *If you'd like to be added to her Group to receive summaries of all Regular and some Special Council meetings by emailing her at souderfornewcastle@gmail.com.*

The primary purpose of this project is to address our 100+ year old storm water infrastructure and repave the main street of our city — something that has not been done for decades. In addition, we want to address vehicular traffic issues; improve pedestrian experience, safety and accessibility (e.g., better alignment of crosswalks, crosswalk markings, ADA curb ramps); improve the historical fabric by replacing concrete curbs with new granite curbs, resetting existing granite curbs, resetting cobblestones at end of the Strand; and improve parking especially ADA compliant handicap parking spaces.


