The building is owned by the Trustees of New Castle Common but is managed by Richard Stat's 326 Associates, L.P. Stat is a Delaware property owner whose holdings include the New Castle Farmer's Market just down the street from the Pathmark.

The Trustees and the City have nothing to do with what businesses are located in the shopping center (or leasing) along DuPont Parkway.

## The New Castle Planning Commission

announced that a survey of residents and business operators will begin on October 1, 2018. The purpose of the survey is to gather information to update the city's ten-year comprehensive plan.

State law requires each community to have a comprehensive plan. The updated plan is due in July of 2019 and will cover the period 2019 to 2029.

The plan is intended to guide city management and development. The survey can be accessed online on the city website

[www.newcastlecitadelaware.gov](http://www.newcastlecitadelaware.gov). Paper copies can be obtained at the City Administration Building, 220 Delaware St., the New Castle Public Library 424 Delaware St., and the New Castle Senior Center, 400 South St. The survey will run from October 1 through November 30. After reviewing the survey results, commission members will conduct neighborhood workshops to develop more detailed information. Planning Commission Chair David Baldini said: "We hope that residents and business operators will take advantage of this significant opportunity to help shape New Castle's future. We are looking forward to broad participation throughout the community."

# APPLE PIE BAKED APPLES

## GONNA NEED ALL THIS!

3 Granny Smith apples - 3 pink lady apples - 1 tbsp. warm water  
2 tsp. Cornstarch - 2 tbsp. Butter - Juice from 1/2 a lemon  
1 tsp. cinnamon, plus more for sprinkling - 1/3 c. granulated sugar,  
plus more for sprinkling - 1 refrigerated pie crust - 1 large egg beaten  
with 1 tbsp. milk (egg wash) - Caramel, for drizzling

## HERE'S HOW

1. Oven happy at 375°. Peel and dice one green and one red apple. Slice off tops and, using a melon baller, hollow out the remaining apples. Set aside.
2. In a small bowl, whisk together warm water and cornstarch.
3. In a small saucepan over medium heat, melt butter. Add diced apples, lemon juice, cinnamon, and sugar. Bring to a simmer and cook until apples are tender, about 5 minutes. Add in cornstarch mixture and cook 5 minutes more.
4. Place hollowed out apples in a baking dish and fill with cooked apple mixture.
5. On a piece of wax paper, roll out pie dough and cut into 4 circles. Slice each circle into thin strips. Make a lattice top on each apple, trimming any excess.
6. Brush crust with egg wash and sprinkle with more cinnamon sugar. Bake until apples are tender and crust is golden, 28 to 30 minutes.
7. Drizzle with caramel before serving.

## A new analysis now ranks Delaware as the worst state in the country for commuters.



Insurance company Esurance looked at time spent commuting, options for commuters, safe driving and overall work-related happiness and concluded every other state in the U.S. is better off than Delaware.

Delaware joined other Atlantic states like New Jersey (No. 49), Maryland (No. 44) and New York (No. 47) at the bottom of the overall rankings.

The state's poor performance stemmed from bad scores in the specific categories. Delaware was next to last in a comparison of improved commute times, 38th in use of alternative transportation like carpooling and buses, 34th in safety and 43rd in workplace happiness and well-being.

## Honey Cider-Beer

*The cider-honey base of this fall beverage makes enough for both adult and kid twists: one with pale ale, the other with sparkling cider. Beer and cider are refreshing and lower in sugar and alcohol than stronger potions, which tend to go down a bit too easily.*

1½ cups apple cider • 1/4 cup honey • 3 cups seltzer water, chilled • ¼ cup fresh lemon juice  
2 12-oz. bottles pale ale-style beer, chilled • 1 Gala apple, cored, thinly sliced crosswise, and divided

### How to...

• Combine cider and honey in a small saucepan over medium-high; bring to a simmer. Cook 10 minutes or until reduced to about 1 cup, stirring occasionally. Remove pan from heat; cool to room temperature. Cover and chill 4 hours or overnight.

• 1/2 cup cider mixture in a large pitcher (reserve remaining 1/2 cup for Honey Cider Cocktails). Add seltzer, lemon juice, and beer to pitcher, stirring to combine. Stir in half of apple slices. Serve over ice; garnish with remaining apple slices.

• **Honey Cider Cocktails Kid-Friendly Variation:** Place remaining 1/2 cup cider mixture in a large pitcher. Add 3 cups chilled seltzer water, 1/4 cup lemon juice, 3 cups chilled sparkling apple cider, and 1 sliced Gala apple, stirring to combine. Serve over ice.
