## Sheriff's House a focus of proposed Delaware National Park

For the past 10 years Sen. Tom Carper has spearheaded a cause he deeply cares about for all present and future Delawareans.

His dream has been to establish a National Park in the first State that's also the last and only State without one.

The rich history of early settlement through our colonial achievements needs to be shared with the nation, as well as all Delawareans. This story would be told through several locations in all three counties. In New Castle County: The Old Sheriff's House, Fort Christina National Historic Landmark, Old Swedes Church National Historic Landmark, Old New Castle Courthouse. In Kent County: John Dickinson Plantation National Historic Landmark, the Dover Green and in Sussex County: the Ryves Holt House.

During the ensuing years and after many meetings, another location has been added to the national park proposal.

Last summer the Woodlawn Trustees property in northern New Castle County became available. During an August public meeting, Blaine Phillips, the Conservation Fund's mid-Atlantic regional director, explained that the organization wants to make sure the land is protected, whether as a national park, a state park or a private reserve.

There are two avenues to become a National Park. Congressional and Presidential. Legislation that has been introduced by the Delaware delegation can travel through committees. (*Remember "I'm a Bill" many of us saw in civic classes?*) Or, the President can designate a location as a National Monument via the Antiquities Act. Both a National Park (Congressional) and National Monument (Presidential) fall under the National Park Service.

Today two properties are favored by the Secretary of the Interior, The Sheriff's House and the Woodlawn Trustees land. One deadline (12/31/12) has passed and the Conservation Fund has been managing the Woodlawn property. That will expire in forty-five days.

# Shepherd's Pie

adapted from **Homecooking in Montana**

- 1 1/2 lbs ground beef (or lamb)
- 1/2 large onion, diced
- 1/2 medium zucchini, grated
- 3 cloves garlic, finely minced
- 1 1/2 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 2 tbsp tomato paste
- 1 tsp fresh thyme (I used 1/2 tsp dried)
- 2 cups beef broth (I made my own beef broth, so this is what I used)



2 tsp salt, or to taste - 3 cups mashed potatoes  
 1/4 cup cheddar cheese, finely grated  
 Couple shakes of Parmesan cheese  
 In a large skillet, brown the beef until no longer pink. Drain off excess grease. Add onion, garlic, and zucchini and sauté for 3-5 minutes.  
 Add Worcestershire sauce and tomato paste. Season with thyme and cook for about 1 minute. Add broth and simmer until 5-10 minutes or until sauce has thickened. Taste and adjust seasoning.  
 Transfer beef to a deep dish. You can use an 8x8 square pan, a casserole or you can make **individual servings**. Spoon mashed potato on top of beef. Sprinkle with grated Parmesan cheese and cheddar cheese. Place the dish on a cookie sheet in case it bubbles over while baking. Bake in a 375° F oven for 20 minutes or until top is brown and heated through. The sides may be bubbly
