Baldton...the therapy dog



Matt & Michelle White's life took a life altering twist when Matt, 43 suffered a stroke in September 2011. The stroke affected the entire right side of his body and his ability to speak/communicate. His rehabilitation is only part of the story Michelle tells. What many may be unfamiliar with is the role of **Baldton, the unexpected therapy dog.** An excerpt is below with the PDF of the article that appeared in the Oct. Issue of *Versatile Hunting Dog*, attached to today's email.

"I was able to bring the dog twice into the rehab hospital to see Matt during his stay. The staff and many other patients enjoyed his visits because he was so well behaved. He loved the attention he received! We never would have imagined our versatile hunting dog would begin his journey with us as a therapy dog, but that is what he has become. Matt made amazing progress during

his stay. He returned home in October, able to walk with a cane, still unable to move his right hand/arm or to speak/communicate many words (because of expressive aphasia), but he was home. The day after Matt returned home, he wanted me to get the dog ready to take a walk. Matt tied the leash to his belt loop so Baldton could walk next to him at a heel. And off they went! Matt was very unsteady on his feet; the dog never pulled but just walked beside him at a slow and steady pace. What has followed is a daily routine of 3-6 mile walks, regardless of the weather".



NEW YORK CITY Knish



These may not be authentic, but they are delicious. The recipe makes 4 large, but can easily make 8 ...

Ingredients

- 6 medium russet potatoes
- 2 1/2 tablespoons butter
- 1/4 minced onion
- 3 tablespoons fat-free chicken broth or 3 tablespoons vegetable broth
- 1/2 teaspoon salt, more to taste
- 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper, more to taste
- seasoning (optional) or chives (optional) or red pepper flakes, to taste (optional)
- 6 sheets phyllo dough



Directions

- ▶ Peel, halve and boil potatoes until tender, 15-20 minutes.
- ▶ Mash in a large bowl.
- ▶ Sauté onion in 1 1/2 tablespoons butter until translucent but not brown.
- ▶ Add to mashed potatoes with broth, salt, pepper and spices.
- ▶ Stir well.
- ▶ Melt remaining tablespoon of butter.
- ▶ Pre-heat oven to 375 degrees.
- ▶ Layer 3 sheets of phyllo dough and cut in half.
- ▶ Repeat with remaining 3 sheets.
- ▶ Spoon 1 cup of potato mixture on each section of phyllo, mold into a large ball and position off-center at one end of strip of dough.
- ▶ Roll ball along the length of phyllo, folding dough over bottom of filling and leaving some filling poking through the top.
- ▶ (Trim and discard excess dough.) Brush melted butter over edges of knish to seal the seams and press down onto an ungreased baking sheet.
- ▶ Repeat with other knishes.
- ▶ Bake 30-40 minutes, until golden brown. Makes four knishes.

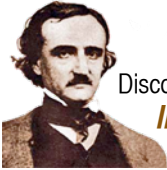

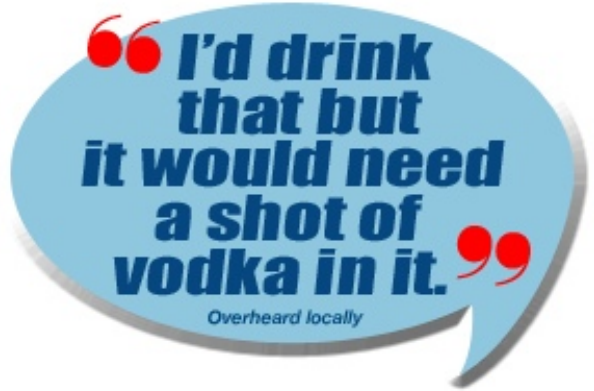

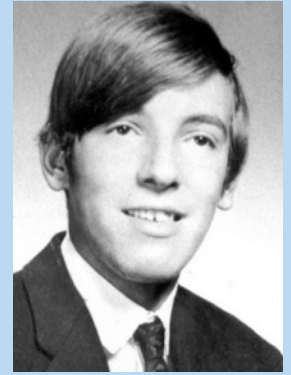

Participants check in at 8:30 AM at Battery Park in Delaware City on Clinton Street, the main street in town. At 9AM, we board buses that take us to the Delaware Maryland line on the C&D canal, just east of North Chesapeake City.
