In **MONEYBALL**, everyone's eyes are firmly focused on Brad Pitt playing real-life Oakland A's general manager, Billy Beane, as he struggles to rebuild a team with the lowest competitive salaries in baseball. His struggle brings him to the concept of using statistical data to choose players, use them more effectively, and pretty much set traditional b-ball on its ear. As a lover of baseball movies, this one fits into the genre very easily. A hunk of a lead character, excellent supporting cast, the use of real game footage mixed in with the new, a hunk of a lead character, humor, warmth, a cute kid who pulls your heart strings, a happy ending, AND a hunk of a....well, you know. Moneyball is an easy movie to watch, be entertained by, and to root for. It's a feel-good trip to the movies that causes the viewer to feel everything happened and ended just the way it should. 

are a great any time of the day, whether it be for breakfast, lunch or dinner or even a quick snack, eggs provide a ton of nutrition for a low cost and they don't take long to prepare. So what kinds of eggs should you choose? Well here are some of the different ways eggs

are marketed in the US.

**Hormone free:** The use of hormones in poultry has been banned since the 1960s. So by law, all eggs are hormone-free. If a carton offers this claim alone, it's a waste of money if it costs more.

**Natural**: This is another meaningless term. According to regulations from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Food and Drug Administration, no additives or colors can ever be added to eggs.

**Cage-free or Free-roaming:** Over 90% of hens are raised in cages that are between 48 and 68 square inches. Birds that are cage-free or free-roaming are not caged; however, they likely were still raised within the confines of a small building and generally do not have access to the outdoors. So this is a distinction without much of a difference.

**Grass-fed:** There is definition of this term hens. Farms touting hens claim their being "wild" as hens are usually freely and so they things found in their grass, bugs, and they might catch.

no USDA-approved when it comes to grass-fed egg laying hens are as close to possible. Grass-fed allowed to roam eat a variety of natural habitat: whatever animals

Certified humane: For a farm to make this claim, it must meet specific criteria: The hens may not


be caged; their feed must be vegetarian and contain no antibiotics; and the birds need to live in a natural environment that allows for behaviors like preening and scratching.

**Fertile:** These are eggs that, when incubated, will develop into chicks. They are no more nutritious than other eggs and are usually priced higher than others. Usually fertile eggs are cage free and come from hen houses where roosters roam as well; some consumers believe this is a more natural habitat.

**USDA-certified organic:** This means that the hens have eaten only organic feed and grain grown without fungicides, herbicides, commercial fertilizers, and pesticides and that their diet hasn't contained any animal or poultry by-products. The hens also have not been given any antibiotics or growth hormones, and they've been allowed access to the outdoor.

#### So what are the best eggs for your nutrition buck?

Look for pastured eggs or those that have access to the outdoors (although this is no guarantee); also get to know your local farmers and find out how their chickens are raised – this is your best bet for the best nutrition and for supporting your local economy and community.

### **Purple Carrot**

The ancestral home of this carrot is Afghanistan, where it figures largely in the cookery of that country. However, this has been a well-known variety in Europe since the Middle Ages and was used by



the Dutch to create the cross with the Lemon Carrot that resulted in the race of orange carrots we know today. Because it turns brown when cooked, the violet carrot has never been a great favorite of chefs, but light cooking retains the color, and it is extremely ornamental in raw salads.


