Proposed riverfront development presented



Existing Condition

The City hosted a presentation last Monday, the 17th, of a riverfront redevelopment idea. It was a result of a preliminary study by Duffield Associates. The City Planning Commission has been involved and the City Council approved funding in the 2011/12 City budget for this study. Citizens voiced their views and shared opinions.

It is important to note that the study's scope is preparation for a waterfront master plan. Boat access is being considered mainly at the end of Delaware Street in the vicinity of the wharf and heading a short distance southwest on the shore of Battery Park. **Equally** important to note is no permits or funding have be sought or applied for. This meeting was a preliminary introduction only. It does include looking at existing structures such as the wharf and the Banks Building. It also includes the pier which has a locked gate near the end that blocks access to a large concrete structure and several ice pier structures.

Some of the tentative ideas which could be part of the redevelopment-

plan include: A limited amount of daytime docking to enable boaters to patronize City shops and restaurants and engage in tourist activities; Appropriate

infrastructure installed to allow vessels like the Kalmar Nyckel to

dock, and also allow docking for small ferries.



MAPLE-WALNUT Dearn Balle

Makes about 20 popcorn balls, which should be eaten whole

and leave your face feeling sticky.

6 tbsps (3/4 stick) butter 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 cup light brown sugar 1/4 cup light corn syrup 2 tbsps maple syrup (Grade B has a robust, more maple-y flavor) 3/4-tsp baking soda 10 cups popped corn (1 plain microwave bag or 1/4 cup kernels) 1 1/2 cups raw walnuts An oiled bowl and two



In a medium, heavy-bottomed saucepan, melt the butter over medium. heat. Add sugars, honey, and corn syrup and cook to 300°F over mediumhigh heat, stirring occasionally. The mixture will look thick and bubbly. Add the baking soda and stir well to incorporate; the mixture will increase in volume.

Spread the popped corn out on a large sheet tray and discard any unpopped kernels. Transfer the popcorn to the oiled bowl. Pour the caramel evenly over the popcorn, then sprinkle the nuts; use 2 heatproof spatulas and toss together until corn is evenly coated.

When the caramel has cooled and is cool enough to handle but not brittle, after 2-3 minutes, toss and shape into 2" balls with lightly oiled hands. Set. on a rack to cool.

Popcorn balls are best within a few days of making and keep for up to a week.



Materials to Make Colorful Pumpkins

Mod Podge brush • Miniature white pumpkins • Colorful tissue paper.

Instructions: Using a paintbrush, apply a thin coat of Mod Podge over a section of the pumpkin. Immediately cover it with a small piece of tissue paper. Continue in small sections until the entire pumpkin is covered.

For very thin, translucent paper, you might need to do more than one coat of paper - in that case, wait until the first coat is dry before applying the second.

*Note—For the polka-dot and striped pumpkins, just use an acrylic paint pen! Super simple!

2 cups pumpkin seeds, rinsed 1 tablespoon olive oil 1 teaspoon kosher or sea salt

Preheat oven to 350°. In a medium-size bowl, toss seeds in oil to coat. Spread on a rimmed baking sheet and sprinkle with salt. Bake about 10 minutes and stir. Bake 5 minutes longer, or until lightly toasted. Transfer to a large shallow plate to cool before serving. **Or** Warm a large cast-iron skillet over medium heat. Add oil, then

seeds, and stir well to coat. Spread mixture in an even layer; stir often until seeds are lightly toasted. Season with salt. Transfer to a large shallow plate to cool before serving. **Spice 'em up** try a tablespoon of cayenne, chili seasoning, smoked paprika, ground cumin or coriander, curry powder, or garlic powder.

6 oz (1 cup) semi-sweet chocolate chips 6 oz (1 cup) milk chocolate chips

Common onions are normally available in three colors: yellow, red, and white. Yellow

onions are full-flavored and are a reliable standby for cooking almost anything. Yellow onions turn a rich, dark brown when cooked and give French onion soup its tangy sweet flavor. The red onion is a good choice for fresh uses or in grilling and char-broiling. White onions are the traditional onion used in classic Mexican cuisine. They have a golden color and sweet flavor when sautéed.

Heirloom

While the large mature onion bulb is the onion most often eaten, onions can be eaten at immature stages. Young plants may be harvested before bulbing occurs and used whole as scallions. [8] When an onion is harvested after bulbing has begun but the onion is not yet mature, the plants are sometimes referred to as summer onions. [9]

Additionally, onions may be bred and grown to mature at smaller sizes. Depending on the mature size and the purpose for which the onion is used, these may be referred to as pearl, boiler, or pickler onions. [9] (However, true pearl onions are a different species.) Pearl and boiler onions may be cooked as a vegetable rather than an ingredient. Pickler onions are, unsurprisingly, often pickled.

Onion seed may be "sprouted", and the resulting sprouts used in salads, sandwiches, and other dishes.


