- The fist-pumping tomato jam isn't the only reason that Cutty's BLTJ is a sterling sandwich. Composition, the skill of arranging the ingredients, is an underheralded art, but it has a real effect on how the flavors hit your palate.
- Makes one sandwich. You'll want two, at least.

ingredients

- 2 slices of white or good quality white or wheat bread, toasted
- Lemony mayo (mix 1 teaspoon of fresh lemon juice into ½ cup of Hellman's mayonnaise)
- ♣ 4 strips of crisp, crisp bacon
- ❖ Small handful of field greens or mesclun mix
- Cutty's tomato jam
- Directions
- Spread lemony mayo on the bottom slice of toast. (The extra lemon in the mayo balances the rich sweetness of the tomato jam).
- Add the greens and then the bacon strips.
- On the other slice of toast, spread a modest layer of tomato jam. The stuff is ridiculously delicious, but it's also powerful stuff. On top of the tomato jam, spread another layer of lemony mayo.
- Top the sandwich, serve with the tomato-jam side on top, and yell, "Tijuana!"

Reduce heat to low and gently simmer, stirring occasionally, until mixture is thick and syrupy, about 1 hour. Cool the jam; season with salt and pepper if necessary. Store in the fridge.



Street, and then proudly relocated to The Helm with Lois.











330th Anniversary
William Penn was born October 14, 1644

in London England. He was the son of Admiral Sir William Penn, a well know friend of the Royals and influential in the court of Charles II and his brother, James, Duke of York.

William Penn lived a privileged life and was well educated and travelled. Although raised as an Anglican Penn went through a profound religion experience at age 22 and embraced the Quaker beliefs. His commitment to his religious beliefs led to persecution, frequent arrests and prison, loss of position and disownment by his family.

Because the Quakers were so severely persecuted in England, Penn petitioned Charles to grant him land in the new world and allow the Quakers to immigrate there and live according to their beliefs. In 1681, Charles II granted William Penn land which will become the Province of Pennsylvania. James, Duke of York will give Penn deeds and leases for what is now the State of Delaware. Penn called this land his Three Lower Counties of New Castle, Kent, and Sussex.

Penn sailed to the new world and landed first in New Castle on October 27, 1682. He came ashore and received the land from John Moll and Ephraim Hermann, the Duke's representatives. Penn spent the night here and then sailed the next day to Upland (Chester, PA) to claim his Pennsylvania province.

William Penn came back to New Castle several times to establish the courts, colonial assembly, and laws under his Frame of Government. In 1701, Penn allowed the Assembly of the Lower Counties to separate from the full Pennsylvania assembly, free to make their own laws but still part of the Pennsylvania province.

William Penn ruled as proprietor and Governor until his death in 1718. His sons took over and governed the Lower Counties until June 15, 1776, when here at the New Castle Court House, the Delaware Assembly voted to separate from Pennsylvania and Great Britain.

It is William Penn and his laws that have set the standard for our own US Constitution and Bill of Rights.

William Penn's Great Laws called for representative government, religious freedom, equal justice in courts, no death penalty except for murder and treason, prison reform, and equality of all individuals.
