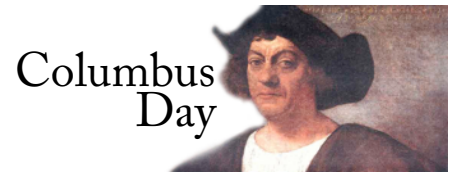

this week in BASEBALL HISTORY

10-9 1969 Just a few days after agreeing to be on the coaching staff of the Angels, **Sparky Anderson** accepts an offer to replace **Dave Bristol** as the manager of the Reds. During his nine-year tenure, in which Cincinnati will average 96 victories a season, the club will win five divisional titles, four National League pennants, and consecutive World Series in 1975 and 1976.

10-10 1973 In the fifth and deciding game, the Mets win National League pennant beating Reds, 7-2. **Tom Seaver** bests **Jack Billingham** in the Shea stadium showdown.

10-11 1968 The Giants name **Clyde King** as the team's new manager, replacing **Herman Franks**. The San Francisco skipper will guide the club to 90 victories next season, but will be fired after blowing an 8-0 lead against the Padres in May, 1970.

10-12 1929 Trailing 8-0 during the fourth game of the World Series, the **Philadelphia A's** erupt for 10 seven-inning runs off three Cub pitchers en route to a 10-8 victory. Chicago's **Hack Wilson** becomes one of the goats of the game when he loses two balls in the sun in center field.

10-13 1971 In the first World Series night game ever played, the Pirates defeat the Orioles at Three Rivers Stadium, 4-3. **Roberto Clemente's** three hits contributes to the Bucs overcoming the Birds three-run first inning.

10-14 2003 Holding a 3-0 lead and needing only five more outs to go the World Series for the first time since 1945, the **Cubs** give up eight runs, on five hits, three walks and an error to the Marlins. The team appears to come apart after a Cub fan, sitting along the left-field line at Wrigley Field, tries to catch a foul ball that was about to be caught by Cubs' outfielder **Moises Alou** for the second out of the inning.

10-15 1964 In his final postseason game, **Mickey Mantle** hits a three-run homer to the opposite field off right-hander **Bob Gibson**, his third dinger of the series. The Sportsman's Park bomb, in the 7-5 loss to the Redbirds in the Fall Classic finale, extends the Mick's World Series record to 18.

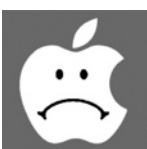

Spice-Rubbed Bacon with Fried Eggs and Toast "Soldiers"

slices. Remove the pan from the oven and put the bacon slices, in a single layer, on the spice mix. Turn them over to lightly coat both sides of each slice

with the spice mix.

Directions

Ah...the smells of breakfast! If the smell of coffee and bacon doesn't wake your family and friends from a deep sleep and send them straight to the kitchen, I don't know what will!

Ingredients

1 tbsp cayenne pepper
1 tbsp garlic powder
2 tbsp dark brown sugar
1/2 tsp black pepper
1/2 tsp curry powder
6 slices thick cut bacon
1/2 loaf sourdough bread cut into 24 (2-inch long and 1-inch) thick rectangles or "soldiers"
4 eggs
Sea salt
Preheat the oven to 220° F.
In a small bowl, add the cayenne, garlic powder, dark brown sugar, black pepper and curry powder and stir to blend. Spread the spice mix on a baking sheet and put it in the oven for 2 minutes. Meanwhile, separate the bacon

Arrange the bacon in 2 large skillets and cook over medium heat until golden brown. Note: because of the [brown sugar](#), the bacon is more prone to burning, especially if cooked too quickly over high heat. As the bacon is cooked, use a slotted spoon or [spatula](#) to transfer the strips to a paper towel to drain. [Drain](#) off any excess [grease](#) from the skillets but leave a small layer in each pan.

Raise the temperature of the oven to 350 degrees F. Arrange the bread on a baking sheet and put it in the center of the oven. When the bread is toasted, remove from the oven and set aside.

Return the skillets to the stove over medium-low heat and crack 2 [eggs](#) into each skillet. Do not overcrowd. Season them lightly with salt. Cook until desired doneness. Transfer the eggs to platter and arrange the bacon and the toast around the eggs. Serve immediately.

HOWTO carve a pumpkin by hammering cookie-cutters into it

Place a cookie cutter on the pumpkin and tap firmly with a rubber mallet until at least half of the cutter has pierced the pumpkin's shell. (If the pumpkin shell is thin, the cutter may be pounded all the way through the shell.)

Remove the cookie cutter, using a needle-nose pliers if needed.

With a small serrated knife (or the serrated saw from a pumpkin carving kit), follow the pattern made from the cookie cutter to cut out the image, making sure to cut all the way through the shell.

However if you have jewelry to donate, you may bring it to the parish office now or give it to any Guild member at church.

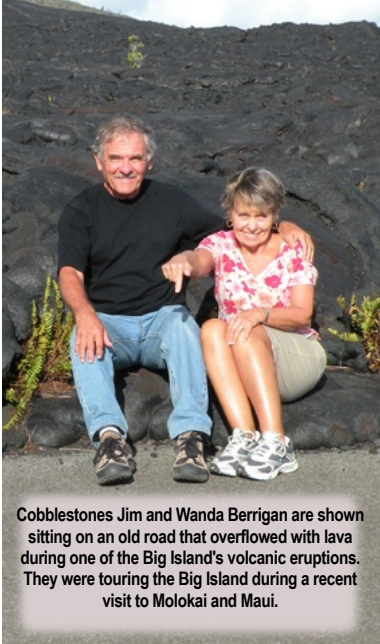
