

## this week in HISTORY

**6** The first Mennonites arrived in America aboard the Concord. 1683, The steamboat *SS California* left New York for San Francisco via Cape Horn, arriving on February 28, 1849. The trip took 4 months and 21 days. 1848, Thomas Edison showed the 1st motion picture 1889, The first, full-length, talkie starring Al Jolson, in *The Jazz Singer* opened in NYC. 1927, E.L. Lyon became the first male nurse for the U.S. Army. 1954

**7** Nine American colonies sent a total of 28 delegates to NYC for the Stamp Act Congress. The delegates adopted the "Declaration of Rights and Grievances." 1765, Edgar Allan Poe, 40, dies a tragic death in Baltimore. 1849, Georgia Tech's Yellow Jackets beat helpless Cumberland College 222-0. 1916, Route 66 starring Martin Milner as Tod Stiles premieres. 1960, The *Youngbloods* Get Together, achieved gold. 1969

**8** The Great Chicago Fire begins in southwest Chicago. 250 people were killed; 98,500 people were left homeless; 1871, Domino Sugar was trademark registered. 1901, Hi Mom, Hi Dad, Hi Dave, Hi Ricky, the Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet debuted on CBS radio. 1944, Yankees Don Larsen pitches the first perfect game in World Series history against the Dodgers. John Lennon releases his megahit Imagine

1971, Star Wars Theme/Cantina Band by Meco topped the charts. 1977

**9** The Collegiate School of Connecticut was chartered in New Haven. The name was later changed to Yale. 1701, Joshua C. Stoddard received a patent for his calliope. 1855, Mr. Aaron Montgomery Ward mailed the first catalog. 1872, The public was first admitted into the Washington Monument. 1888, Woodrow Wilson becomes first president to attend a world series game. 1915, ABC Radio presented Land of the Lost for the first time. 1943, Hit The Road Jack by Ray Charles was #1.

**10** The billiard ball was patented by John Wesley Hyatt. 1865, Griswold Lorillard (of Lorillard tobacco) wore a tailless dress coat that was tailored in England. He wore it to the country club at Tuxedo Park, New York; therefore, the name: tuxedo. 1886, The Panama Canal opens. 1911, Dreft, the first synthetic detergent, went on sale. 1933, The Red Baron made his first appearance in the Peanuts comic strip. 1965, Neil Diamond's Cracklin' Rosie had toes tappin in 1970, It was all over but the pantyhose commercials for Joe Namath, as he ended his playing career. 1977

**11** The Juliana, the first steam-powered ferryboat, was put into operation by inventor John Stevens. It went between NYC and Hoboken. 1811, An adding machine, the Comptometer was patented. 1887, David Henderson Houston patented the first roll film for cameras. 1881, JCPenney opened a store in Milford, DE, making it a nationwide company with stores in all 48 states. 1929,

Spencer Tracy's classic movie, The Old Man and the Sea was released. 1958, Space Shuttle Challenger astronaut Kathryn Sullivan became the first American woman to walk in space. 1984

**12** Christopher Columbus, sighted Watling Island in the Bahamas. 1492, The very first Oktoberfest is held in Munich, Bavaria, Germany 1810, In celebration of the 400th anniversary of the Columbus landing the original version of the Pledge of Allegiance was first recited in public schools. 1892, Filming began on The Wizard of Oz. 1938, The George Burns and Gracie Allen Show made its debut. 1950

***Basting the steak with butter not only adds flavor  
but helps develop a crust. Don't skip it!***

### **The steak**

1 lb. Angus NY strip steak - Kosher salt - Freshly ground black pepper

### **The butter**

1 c. butter, softened - Zest of half a lemon - 2 cloves garlic, minced -  
1 ms. shallot, minced - 2 tbsp. dijon mustard - 1 tbsp. prepared  
horseradish - 1/4 tsp. paprika - 2 tbsp. freshly chopped parsley - 1  
tbsp. chopped chives - Kosher salt - Freshly ground black pepper

### **The potatoes**

3 tbsp. vegetable oil, divided - 1 lb. baby potatoes, quartered

### **The doin'**

Remove steak from refrigerator and let come to room temperature, 30 minutes. Season all over with salt and pepper. Meanwhile, make cowboy butter: In a medium bowl, combine all cowboy butter ingredients and stir to combine. Season with salt and pepper.

Place on plastic wrap and form into a log. Refrigerate until firm, 30 minutes.

Heat 1 tbsp vegetable oil in a large cast iron skillet over medium heat. Add potatoes and cook, stirring occasionally, until fork tender, 6 to 8 minutes.

1. Drop approximately 1 tablespoon cowboy butter into potatoes and toss until butter is completely melted and potatoes are coated. Remove potatoes from skillet, wipe out pan, and return to heat.
2. Heat remaining vegetable oil until just beginning to smoke. Add steak and cook, flipping occasionally, until a golden crust begins to form on both sides of the steak, and the internal temperature reaches 145°, about 5 minutes.
3. Reduce heat to medium low and add approximately 2 tbsp cowboy butter to the pan. Using a kitchen towel, carefully grip the skillet handle and tilt towards you so that the melting butter forms a pool at the bottom of the skillet. Using a spoon, continually baste butter onto steak to form a deeper golden crust. Flip steak and repeat, 2 to 3 minutes in total. Using a meat thermometer, check for doneness: 120-125°F for medium rare, 130°F for medium.
4. Remove steak from skillet and place on cutting board to rest, 10 minutes. Slice and serve with potatoes, dotted with cowboy butter. Watch the [VIDEO](#)

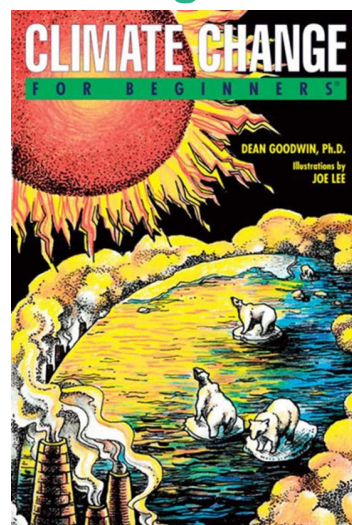
