


Basting the steak with butter not only adds flavor but helps develop a crust. Don't skip it!

#### The steak

1 lb. Angus NY strip steak - Kosher salt - Freshly ground black pepper

#### The butter

1 c. butter, softened - Zest of half a lemon - 2 cloves garlic, minced - 1 ms. shallot, minced - 2 tbsp. dijon mustard - 1 tbsp. prepared horseradish - 1/4 tsp. paprika - 2 tbsp. freshly chopped parsley - 1 tbsp. chopped chives - Kosher salt -Freshly ground black pepper

### The potatoes

3 tbsp. vegetable oil, divided - 1 lb. baby potatoes, quartered

### The doin'

Remove steak from refrigerator and let come to room temperature, 30 minutes. Season all over with salt and pepper Meanwhile, make cowboy butter: In a medium bowl, combine all cowboy butter ingredients and stir to combine. Season with salt and pepper.

Place on plastic wrap and form into a log. Refrigerate until firm, 30 minutes.

Heat 1 tbsp vegetable oil in a large cast iron skillet over medium heat. Add potatoes and cook, stirring occasionally, until fork tender, 6 to 8 minutes.

- 1.Drop approximately 1 tablespoon cowboy butter into potatoes and toss until butter is completely melted and potatoes are coated. Remove potatoes from skillet, wipe out pan, and return to heat.
- 2. Heat remaining vegetable oil until just beginning to smoke. Add steak and cook, flipping occasionally, until a golden crust begins to form on both sides of the steak, and the internal temperature reaches 145°, about 5 minutes.
- 3. Reduce heat to medium low and add approximately 2 tbsp cowboy butter to the pan. Using a kitchen towel, carefully grip the skillet handle and tilt towards you so that the melting butter forms a pool at the bottom of the skillet. Using a spoon, continually baste butter onto steak to form a deeper golden crust. Flip steak and repeat, 2 to 3 minutes in total. Using a meat thermometer, check for doneness: 120-125°F for medium rare, 130°F for medium.
- 4. Remove steak from skillet and place on cutting board to rest,
  10 minutes. Slice and serve with potatoes, dotted with cowboy butter.






