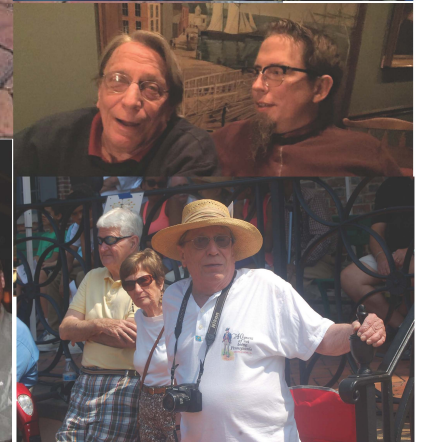
### this week in HISTORY

Oct 8th, 19\*\* - Your Teditor-in-Chief, Ted Joslin, AKA "Lord Mayor of New Castle" was born in Weimington to Josephine and Richard Joslin. He hit the presses pretty quickly, as newspapering was a family business. The blocks that teach most toddlers their ABCs were just a primer of letterpress for the soon-to-be icon of the News-Journal, now the award winning documentarian of all the buzz in Old New Castle.

### this week in HISTORY

**9** The *Collegiate School of Connecticut* was chartered in New Haven. The name was later changed to *Yale*. 1701, *Joshua C. Stoddard* received a patent for his calliope. 1855, *Mr. Aaron Montgomery Ward* mailed the first catalog. 1872, The public was first admitted into the *Washington Monument*. 1888, *Woodrow Wilson* becomes first president to attend a world series game. 1915, ABC Radio presented *Land of the Lost* for the first time. 1943, **Hit** *The Road Jack* by Ray Charles was #1.

**10** The billiard ball was patented by *John Wesley Hyatt*. 1865, *Griswold Lorillard* (of Lorillard tobacco) wore a tailless dress coat that was tailored in England. He wore it to the country club at Tuxedo Park, New York; therefore, the name: tuxedo. 1886, The *Panama Canal* opens. 1911, *Dreft*, the first synthetic detergent, went on sale. 1933, The *Red Baron* made his first appearance in the *Peanuts* comic strip. 1965, *Neil Diamond's* **Cracklin' Rosie** had toes tappin in 1970. It was all over but the pantyhose commercials for *Joe Namath*, as he ended his playing career. 1977

**11** The *Juliana*, the first steam-powered ferryboat, was put into operation by inventor John Stevens. It went between NYC and Hoboken. 1811, An adding machine, the *Comptometer* was patented. 1887, *David Henderson Houston* patented the first roll film for cameras. 1881,

*JCPenney* opened a store in *Milford, DE*, making it a nationwide company with stores in all 48 states. 1929, *Spencer Tracy's* classic movie, **The Old Man and the Sea** was released. 1958, Space Shuttle *Challenger* astronaut *Kathryn Sullivan* became the first American woman to walk in space. 1984

**12** *Christopher Columbus*, sighted Watling Island in the Bahamas. 1492, The very first *Oktobefest* is held in Munich, Bavaria, Germany 1810, In celebration of the 400th anniversary of the Columbus landing the original version of the *Pledge of Allegiance* was first recited in public schools. 1892, Filming began on **The Wizard of Oz.** 1938, The **George Burns and Gracie Allen Show** debuted. 1950

**13** The *US Continental Congress* ordered the construction of a naval fleet. 1775, The cornerstone of what was termed the *President's House* was laid by George Washington. 1792, *B'nai B'rith* was founded. 1843, An ultrasonic burglar alarm was patented by *Samuel Bagno*. 1953, Bing Crosby and Frank Sinatra introduced the **Ford Edsel** on an hour long special. 1957, 'Little' *Donny Osmond* received a shiny gold record for his rendition of the Steve Lawrence hit, **Go Away Little Girl**. 1971

**14** *Theodore Roosevelt* was shot while campaigning in Milwaukee. Not seriously as he continued with his planned speech. *William Schrenk* was captured at the scene of the shooting. 1912, The book *Winnie-the-Pooh*, by A.A. Milne, made its debut. 1926, With a cast of 25,000, the *C.B. DeMille* epic, **The Ten Commandments**, starring Charlton

Heston, began filming in Egypt. 1954, First live telecast from a manned US spacecraft (*Apollo 7*). 1968,

**15** *Grace Bedell*, 11 years old, wrote a letter to presidential candidate *Abraham Lincoln*. The letter stated that Lincoln would look better if he would grow a beard. 1860, *US Supreme Court* struck down part of the Civil Rights Act of 1875. It allowed for individuals and corporations to discriminate based on race. 1883, **I Love Lucy** premiered on television. 1951, An American treasure died. *Cole Porter*, lyricist and composer, died at age 73. 1964, The *Freedom of Information Act* was passed. 1984

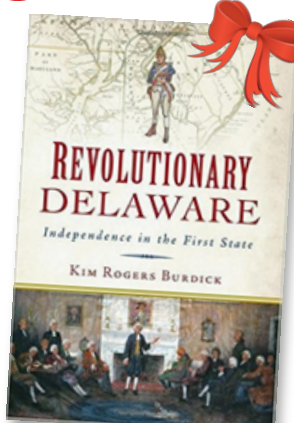

# Cheeseburger & Fry Pie

**gonna need** 1/3 lb  
bacon, cut  
crosswise  
into 1/4  
inch pieces  
• 1 sm yellow  
onion, diced • 1 lb  
lean ground beef • 1  
tspn kosher salt • 1/2  
tspn freshly ground  
black pepper • 2/3 cup  
mayo • 1/3 cup ketchup •  
1/4 cup hamburger dill pickle  
chips, finely chopped • 3 tbsps dill

pickles • 1 9-oz can shoestring potatoes • 1/3 cup  
grated sharp cheddar cheese • 1 med tomato, cored & diced • 1  
cup shredded iceberg lettuce

**here's how** In a medium frying pan over medium-high heat, cook the bacon until brown and crispy. Remove and drain on a paper-towel-lined plate. Add the onion to the pan and cook until softened for 7 to 8 minutes. Add the beef, salt and pepper to the pan and, using a wooden spoon to break up chunks, cook until the beef is cooked through and browned for about 8 minutes.

**make the sauce** In a small bowl, whisk together the mayo, ketchup, diced pickles and pickle brine. Spread the shoestring potatoes on a quarter sheet pan in an even layer. Top with the cooked beef, spreading evenly, then drizzle with the sauce. Spread the grated cheese over.

Preheat the broiler to high. Put the pan beneath the broil, about 2 inches from the heating element, and broil until the cheese melts. Remove from the oven and top with the diced tomato and shredded iceberg. Serve immediately.

# PIÑA COLADA

FOR THE "BLOOD"

3 tbsps corn syrup ~ 1/4 tsp red food coloring

FOR THE DRINK

20 oz pineapple juice ~ 1 can (15 oz) cream of coconut  
~ 1/2 cup heavy cream ~ 1 cup orange juice

10 oz good-quality rum

MAKE IT

Pour the corn syrup in a shallow bowl. Dip a toothpick into the food coloring, and stir a very small amount into the syrup to combine. Hold a glass by the stem, dip rim into the syrup mixture, and turn glass slowly, coating entire rim. Turn the glass upright, allowing mixture to drip down sides. Dip the remaining glasses. Set aside.

Whisk together drink ingredients. Place 2 1/2 cups ice in a blender, and add 1 cup drink mixture. Blend until smooth; add more pineapple juice if mixture is too thick. Repeat with remaining ice and mixture.

Carefully pour into prepared glasses; **ENJOY**

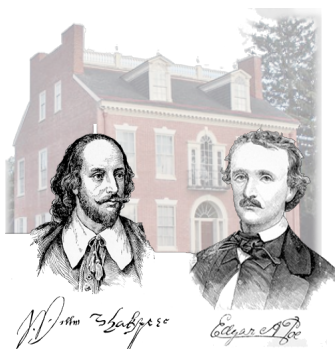

## Mums are as ubiquitous as pumpkins in the fall.

You can find them everywhere and anywhere from nurseries to supermarkets to gas stations. However, once you get them home they are incredibly easy to kill.

They dry out in a nanosecond and need to be watered at least once a day. After the repeated stress of drying out, they often just up and die. Here are five tips to keep your mums from croaking.

**Re-pot** This is the single most important thing you can do to increase the longevity of your mums. Most mums are completely root bound when you get them. The roots have taken up the entire pot, which makes it really hard for the soil to retain any water. The best way to deal with this is to provide your mums with more soil by re-potting them. Carefully remove the mum from its nursery pot. Break up any roots you can, or simply rough them up by rubbing them. Put the plant in the new pot, making sure the surface of the soil rests at least an inch below the lip of the new pot, which is done so there is room for water, instead of the water running off the soil out of the pot. Fill in around the plant's root ball with the potting soil, because you want soil, not air surrounding the roots. Tamp down soil gently. Give the pot a good watering—until it flows out of the bottom of the pot. You may need to add more soil after watering the first time.

**Lots of sun** Mums are sun-lovers, so make sure your pot gets at minimum, 4 hours of direct sun a day. As the fall days are short and the sun has already moved across the horizon since the summer, you may find that the places you get the most sun have moved.

**Water**, but not too much - Mums do not like to get dry. When their leaves are drooping, which can happen ridiculously quickly,



they are way too dry. Try to water them before they get to that state. If you haven't re-potted your mum, which let's face it, lots of us (understandably) won't do, there are two ways to tell if it's dry. You can also try picking up the pot. If it's light, water and water deeply. You usually water plants until the water pours out the bottom, but with a pot bound mum, it's possible that the water will go around the roots, down the sides of the pot and out the bottom without the

plant getting much water. Also, if you've let the plant dry out, the soil contracts and the same thing can happen. To avoid this, and to re-hydrate dry soil, put the mum pot in a bucket of water with a few inches of water and leave it to soak for a few hours.. You can also fully submerge the pot in a bucket of water to re-hydrate the soil. Stick a skewer or a pencil in the soil at the top to make sure the water soaks in.

**Deadhead** It's one of those tedious garden chores that almost as soon as you finish it, you have to start over again. I've found that if I deadhead while I'm talking on the phone or listening to music with headphones, it makes it much more enjoyable. Deadheading mums is worth the trouble though. They will look much better and chances are they will last longer.

**Choose a strong plant** Choosing the right plant is key to having it thrive. A plant that has repeatedly dried out will be stressed and not a good candidate. If you buy a mum at a supermarket or big box store, be particularly careful because they often are under-watered. It even makes sense to ask the store what day they get their new shipments and try to buy one on the day they get there, before they've had too many chances to be neglected. Look for plants where the leaves are deep green and healthy, not droopy. Find plants that have lots of buds and not too many blooms.
