## Farm'Stand'Renovation

**Delaware Greenways** originally secured a Community Water Quality Improvement Plan Grant funded by DNREC to install a green roof on the farm stand and implement other measures to reduce surface water pollutant loads. After determining that the existing structure could not support a green roof, we obtained approval from DNREC for a revised scope of work to include:

- Building a free standing green roofed structure adjacent to existing Farm Stand
- Reroof the existing Farm Stand with a new thermal efficient roof
- Include rainwater capture systems

Greenways engaged architectural firm Method Design to develop concepts, design and oversee implementation. We worked together on a full construction master plan for the farm stand area that is consistent with our long-term vision for the farm. We propose to implement Phase 1 of this master plan now. This phase will accomplish the revised scope of work, above, and will be funded through the CWQI grant to be completed by June 4, 2016. **Discover the new Farm Stand at their Open House!**

**"Shakespeare/Poe: A Night of Readings from the Dark Side,"** its annual visit with masters of the macabre in three remarkable venues around New Castle County.

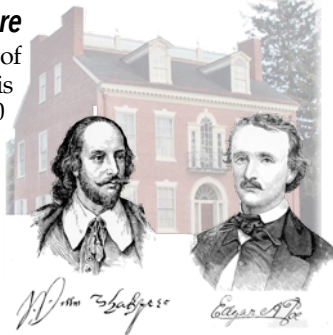
Performances will be, at 6 p.m. and at 8 p.m. (two shows)

# Apple Roses



go to market and get....

1 large red apple, cored and very thinly sliced • 1/4 cup white sugar • 1 tsp ground cinnamon • 1 sheet frozen puff pastry, thawed • 1/4 cup melted butter • 1 egg • 2 tps water • 1 tsp confectioners' sugar (optional)

now here's how...

- Fire up the oven to 375°
- Put apple slices in microwave safe bowl. Fill bowl with water and juice from half a lemon. Use enough water to make sure apple slices are covered by water. Microwave for 3 minutes. This will soften the apple slices and make them more pliable for rolling up.
- Next grab a sheet of puff pastry. Flour your board and roll out the puff pastry enough to make 6 strips at 3 inches wide. Use your pizza wheel put you can use a knife.
- In a bowl mix your favorite fruit preserves with a couple tablespoons of water. Then spoon out the preserves in the center of the strip of puff pastry.
- Now... place the apple slices long ways halfway on the strip. Keep adding slices until you reach the end. Then fold the puff pastry over the bottom of the apple slices.
- Role up the puff pastry and place in a greased muffin tin.
- Bake the apple roses for 35-45 minutes.
- Pull out of oven and let cool for 5 minutes.

# Morgue-A-Rita

## Goo Ingredients

1/4 cup light corn syrup  
green food coloring

## Cocktail

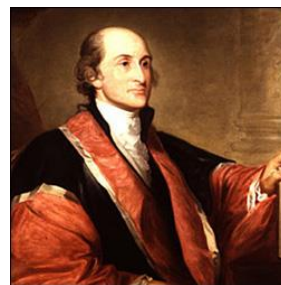
1/2 c. fresh lime juice • 1 c. club soda  
3/4 c. Tequila • 3 oz triple sec  
4 cherries • 4 tsp maraschino cherry syrup

## Instructions

1. Mix together 1/4 cup light corn syrup with green food dye. **Tip:** Start with just a little coloring and add.
2. Place glasses in the freezer to frost them. When frozen, dip each glass into the green syrup and invert to allow the syrup to drip slightly. Return glasses to the freezer to set.
3. Insert stirrers through maraschino cherries for each drink and set aside.
4. Juice the limes and strain if desired to remove pulp (Image 1).
5. Combine tequila, triple sec and lime juice in a cocktail shaker with ice and shake until very cold (Image 2).
6. Pour one teaspoon of the maraschino cherry syrup into the bottom of each glass. Add a cherry and stirrer to each glass.
7. Carefully pour the margarita mixture into each glass till about 3/4 full. **Tip:** Pour very slowly to avoid disturbing the syrup on the bottom.
8. Top off each drink with 1/4 cup club soda and serve immediately.

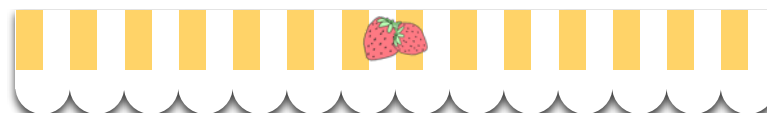

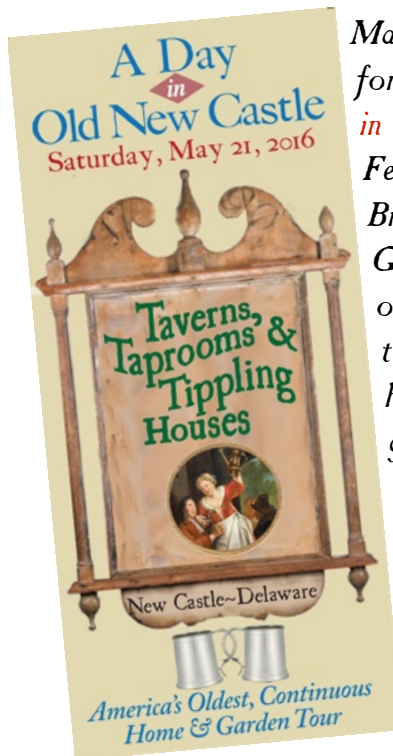
