

# **REVISITED** to be **RELEASED**

Telling a story in pictures is **New Castle Revisited**, by local author **Michael Connolly** is set to release on October 27th. The book boasts 200 vintage images, many of which have never been published, and showcases memories of days gone by. The latest addition to Arcadia Publishing's popular Images of America series should be a number one on your shopping list this season.

#### Highlights of *New Castle Revisited* include:

- Most of the images in the book are from the collection of the New Castle Historical Society.
- The book includes all new images from the first New Castle book.
- An entire chapter is dedicated to the history of the New Castle waterfront, which has been a vital part of the town for almost four centuries.






