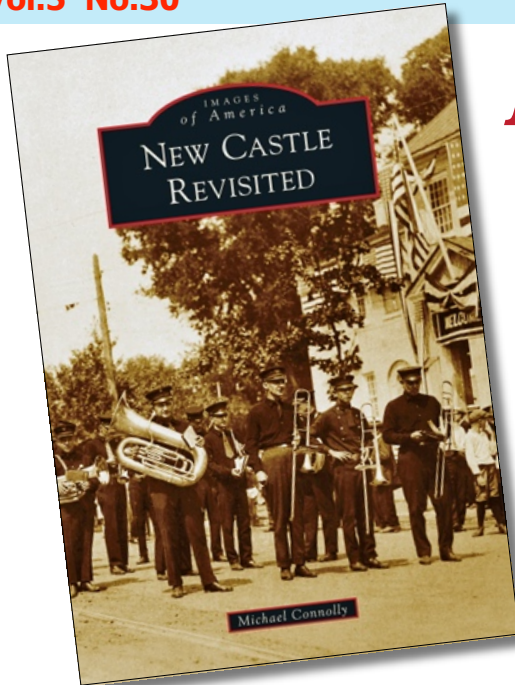

# the JUICIEST BURGER



**We love our burgers!** We all have our theories and techniques on the best way to cook a burger. Today we've stumbled across the trick to making the juiciest burgers every single time.

**NO** special equipment to make the juiciest, most perfect of burgers. **NO** fancy beef or a high-tech grill.

But, you will need lots of butter -- a whole stick -- and a working oven.

In a large pitcher or punch bowl, combine the apple cider, rum, and lemon juice; chill for up to 12 hours. Serve over ice and garnish with the apple.

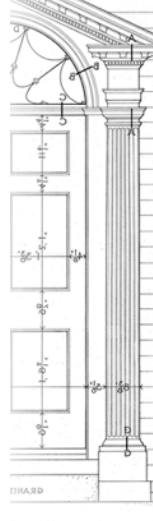

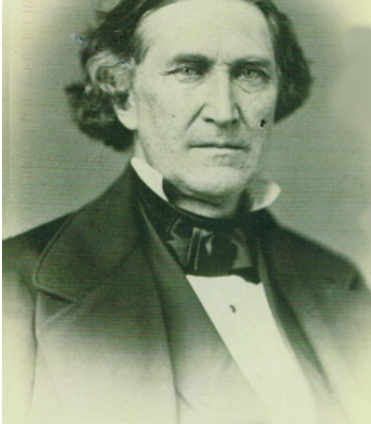
