



1/2 c. chopped almonds - 1/2 tsp kosher salt Vanilla ice cream or whipped cream, for topping (optional)

Directions

Preheat the oven to 350° Butter a 1 1/2-quart baking dish. Toss the apples, blackberries, granulated sugar, 1/2 tsp cinnamon, 1/4 tsp nutmeg, the lemon zest and juice, flour and 4 tbsps melted butter in

In another bowl, combine the cones, brown sugar, the remaining 1/2 tsp cinnamon and 1/4 tsp nutmeg, the almonds, salt and the remaining 4 tbsps melted butter.

Pour half of the apple-berry mixture into the prepared baking dish. Scatter half of the cone mixture on top. Spread the remaining appleberry mixture on top, then sprinkle with the remaining cone mixture. Bake until the apples are soft and the topping is golden brown, 40 to 45 minutes. Transfer the dish to a rack and let sit 10 minutes before serving. Top with ice cream or whipped cream, if desired.
