Wolf Constitution

was launched 219 years ago this Friday in 1797.

The USS Constitution was among the first six frigates built for America's Navy after the Revolutionary War. To ensure the ship remains intact, the aging vessel was removed from the water to undergo major repairs at the Charlestown Navy Yard in Boston where visitors can still walk the deck. While in dry dock the hull of the legendary vessel is fully visible. A view of the ship's underside reveals a rare glimpse of the oxidized copper sheathing that

has protected it from wood boring mollusks and saltwater for decades. The 3,400 sheets will be removed and replaced. The process will briefly offer visitors a glimpse of the wood below.

The USS Constitution earned the nickname, "Old Ironsides," when cannon balls bounced off her frame during victorious battles against the British in the War of 1812. Thousands of sailors have served on the ship and today the USS Constitution remains staffed with a Navy crew.

Ship restorer Anita Petricone is among dozens of people tasked with repairing the vessel.

"This ship is alive," said Petricone. "She's got all the energy accumulated from all her sailors, the battles, everything. She never lost a battle."

"I'm looking at how this has been put together over the years," said ship restorer John Hinckley, who sees the challenges and benefits of old construction meeting new. "Nothing is symmetrical. Everything is a little bit different."

Hinckley noted that repairs were done by hand in the past, but now, "We've got two cranes running to move this stuff around."

The restoration is expected to take more than two years and cost between \$12 million and \$15 million.

The U.S. Navy will pick up the tab.

In 1797, while observing the launch of USS United States, Joshua Humphreys wrote to the Secretary of War, that "...without straining or hogging more than one & a quarter inch, as you will see by the enclosed certificate, to my

great and unspeakable satisfaction. The firmness of the ship was convincing proof of the utility of the diagonal riders in long ships, "1 Today the same may be said for *Constitution*. When undocked in September 1995, the hog was measured to be less than two inches. The effectiveness of the structural components is again shown with "convincing proof" and "unspeakable satisfaction". Given the satisfactory condition of the hull and the successful completion of the repairs

of the hull and the successful completion of the repairs, *Constitution* is being readied to sail in celebration of her bicentennial. On July 21, 1997, for the first time since 1881, *Constitution* will make passage

under her own sail, sailing in Massachusetts Bay under topsails, jibs, and spanker -- her battle configuration. With a Navy crew and under specified weather conditions of winds less than 15 knots and seas less than two feet, *Constitution* will sail again as a salute to the Nation.

Joshua Humphreys is owed credit for the 200 year story of success of *Constitution*. It is his innovative design in building a structurally stiff hull that resolved the design criteria of fast speed under sail while carrying heavy armament. The history of this Nation rests on *Constitution* as a unique example of American technology. *Constitution* has become a lasting National symbol as a product of Humphreys' design.

The Joshua Humphreys mentioned is the g,g,g grandfather of Cobblestone member and lifelong friend of the Teditor, Josh Humphreys of New Bern, NC.

At the dedication of The Humphreys Building at the Washington Navy Yard last April, our friend Josh addressed Navy officials and guests saying "The Humphreys family is delighted to be here this morning, for the rededication of this beautiful building.

The family has been honored twice before. In July, 1919, DD-236 was launched and named USS Humphreys, and in 1987, USNS Joshua Humphreys was launched (and may still be in service today)".

"It is also an honor to be here with representatives of the crew of USS Constitution, the longest serving naval ship under commission, quite possibly in the world. My family and I have always been welcomed aboard old ironsides whenever we have visited Boston, he said."
