



The Delaware Byways Program


is a collaborative effort of Delaware's citizens, local, state and federal government. During the 2000 legislative session, the General Assembly passed Senate Bill 320 authorizing DelDOT to develop what was then known as the Delaware Scenic and Historic Highways Program. Senate Bill 320 required that the program be developed under the guidance of an Advisory Board and it required that the Board be comprised of a wide range of interests. Members of the Board include representatives of local and county government, other state agencies, metropolitan planning organizations, various environmental and historic preservation advocacy groups, and other interested individuals. The program has since been rebranded is now known as the Delaware Byways Program.

18 The **Mason-Dixon line** was agreed upon. 1767, **Samuel Morse** laid his first telegraph cable. 1842, The first broadcast of **Perry Mason** was presented on CBS Radio. 1943, The first computer-arranged marriage took place on **Art Linkletter's show**. 1958, **Walt Disney's** "Jungle Book" is released. 1967

19 The **Revolutionary War** ended. 1781, The first documented performance of "**The Defence of Fort McHenry**" with music took place at the Holliday Street Theatre. 





Cure the chill with this tummy warmer

Cream of Fresh Tomato Soup



Ingredients

- 3 tbsps good olive oil - 1
- ½ cups chopped red onions (2 onions) - 2 carrots, unpeeled and chopped
- 1 tbsp minced garlic (3 cloves)
- 4 lb vine-ripened tomatoes, coarsely chopped (5 large) - 1 ½
- tsps sugar - 1 tbsp tomato paste -
- ¼ cup packed chopped fresh basil

leaves, plus julienned basil leaves, for garnish - 3
 cups chicken stock - 1 tbsp kosher salt - 2 tsps freshly ground black pepper -
 ¾ cup heavy cream - Croutons, for garnish

Directions

Heat the olive oil in a large, heavy-bottomed pot over medium-low heat. Add the onions and carrots and sauté for about 10 minutes, until very tender. Add the garlic and cook for 1 minute. Add the tomatoes, sugar, tomato paste, basil, chicken stock, salt, and pepper and stir well. Bring the soup to a boil, lower the heat, and simmer, uncovered, for 30 to 40 minutes, until the tomatoes are very tender.

Add the cream to the soup and process it through a food mill into a bowl, discarding only the dry pulp that's left. Reheat the soup over low heat just until hot and serve with julienned basil leaves and/or croutons.

trenchless technology



New Castle MSC hosted Div of Public Health, Echologics, Representatives from several Delaware Public Works municipalities last Thursday for a demonstration of **ePulse condition assessment trenchless technology**. The Division of Public Health's Drinking Water State Revolving Grant Fund provided a \$50,000 grant to New Castle City in support of the utilization of new technologies to assess its water infrastructure. New Castle City contracted with Echologics to use its ePulse technology to conduct acoustic leak detection and condition assessment. ePulse uses sound wave technology to deliver sound waves through pipelines in an effort to determine the presence of any leaks and pipe wall thickness.
