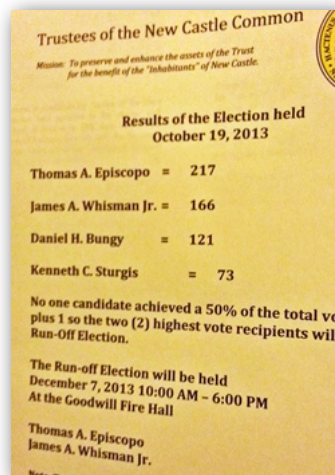

Four candidates vied for the sole seat on the Trustees of New Castle Common. The results were: **Thomas A. Episcopo 217; James A. Whisman, Jr. 166; Daniel H. Bungy 121 and Kenneth C. Sturgis 73.**

Since no candidate received a total of 50% of the vote plus one, there will be a runoff election between Messrs. Episcopo and Whisman on Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup> at the Good-Will Fire Hall between the hours of 10am and 6pm.

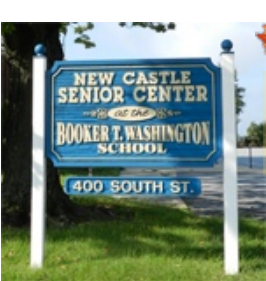

## mini scalloped potatoes

gotta have

you're fix'n for six

Unsalted butter, softened, for the ramekins  
1 ¼ c.s grated sharp white cheddar cheese  
½ c. grated parmesan cheese  
1 tbsp finely chopped fresh chives  
¼ tsp all-purpose flour  
Large pinch of cayenne pepper  
1 ½ lbs. Yukon Gold potatoes  
(1½ to 2 inches in diameter),  
unpeeled  
Kosher salt and freshly ground  
black pepper  
1 c. plus 2 tbsps heavy cream

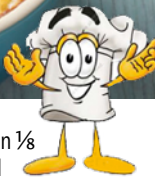
### how to do it

**Crank up the oven to 350°**

Generously brush six 6-to-8-oz ramekins with butter. Combine the cheddar, parmesan, chives, flour and cayenne in a large bowl. Thinly slice the potatoes a little less than ¼ inch thick (a mandoline works well) and add to the cheese mixture. Add 1 tsp salt and a pinch of black pepper and toss to combine.

Divide half of the potato-cheese mixture among the prepared ramekins, filling them about halfway (arrange the potato slices so they go to the edge of the ramekins). Top with half of the cream. Repeat with the remaining potato-cheese mixture and cream.

Transfer the ramekins to a baking sheet, cover each with foil and bake until the liquid is bubbly and the potatoes begin to soften but are not completely cooked through, about 40 minutes. Increase the oven temperature to 425°, uncover the ramekins and bake until the potatoes are tender and golden brown, 15 to 20 minutes. Run a knife around the edges and let stand 10 minutes before serving.

#### ingredients

- ◆ 1/2 oz Hpnotiq liqueur\*
- ◆ 1 oz super premium vodka

- ◆ 1 canned grade AA lychee in syrup, drained
- ◆ 1/4 tsp cherry, strawberry or raspberry preserves
- ◆ 1 blueberry

#### do it

1. Pour the ingredients into a cocktail shaker filled with ice.
2. Shake well.
3. Strain into a chilled cocktail glass.

#### eyeball garnish

1. Dry lychee and fill with preserves
2. Place blueberry, blossom end facing out, into the cavity.
3. Skewer with cocktail pick (search for Halloween theme picks or picks that look like a miniature ice pick for the full affect).

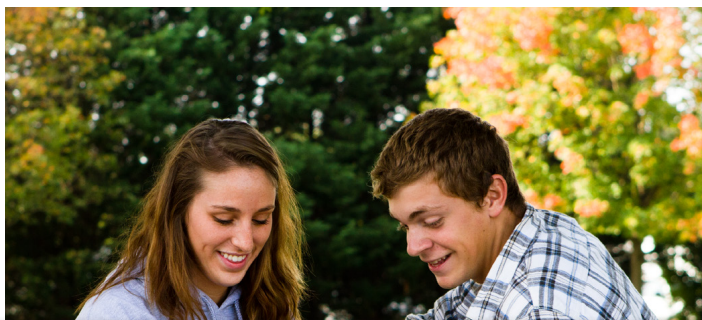

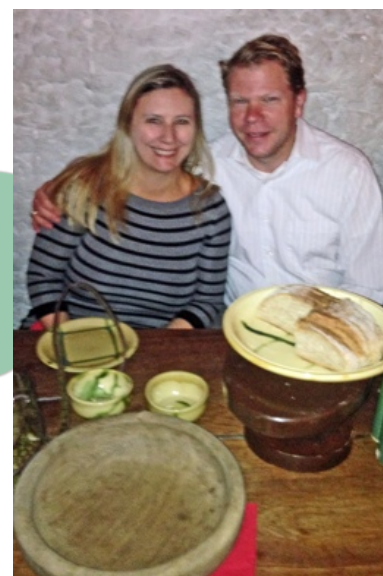
