William Penn Day



The New Castle Court House Museum hosted a day long series of events commemorating the 336th anniversary of Penn's Oct. 27, 1682 arrival at New Castle, the site of his first landing in the New World. The morning started with the Livery of Seisen reenactment. Penn had received a grant of land from Charles II of England for the land of Pennsylvania but he received the land comprising Delaware from the King's brother, James, Duke of York. This Penn called his 3 lower counties of Pennsylvania.

To formally claim his property he must go through an ancient English ritual of transferring land from one owner to another; this is called Livery of Seisen. The Symbols were: A handful of dirt, representing the land, a twig, representing all that grows on the land, a cup of water, all water resources on the land, and in Penn's case, a key, representing the town and government. A Baroque music concert , "1670 Tryal of William Penn" (historical play on the 1670 trial of Penn), tours of the Museum, among others rounded lut the day.
