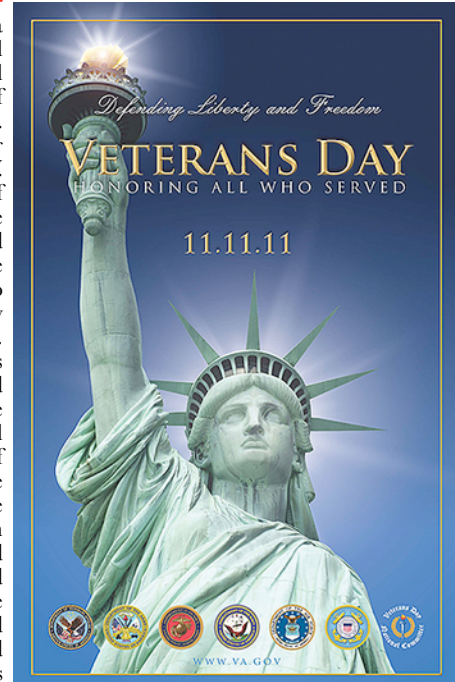

In his 1954 **Veterans Day Proclamation, President Dwight D. Eisenhower** called for the formation of a Veterans Day National Committee to oversee national planning and coordination of the Veterans Day observance. He named the Administrator of Veterans' Affairs, Harvey V. Higley, as Chairman of committee and called upon the heads of all departments and agencies of the executive branch of the government to assist the committee in every way possible. Higley called together leaders of veterans' groups and asked them to serve on the committee. The original committee consisted of associate chairmen from the following organizations: The American Legion, American Veterans of World War II and Korea (AMVETS), Disabled American Veterans, Marine Corps League, United Spanish War Veterans, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

## Awesome **Shrimp Pie**

Named after the sandwich that was invented in New Orleans in the 1920s to feed those who couldn't afford a large meal. We've "stolen" a **pizza recipe with shrimp, a spinach and cream cheese mixture, generously topped with provolone cheese**. Recipe uses two 8 inch pizza crusts - store bought is just fine, but if you want to make your own we have a great, healthy, whole grain **➔** recipe for you.



This recipe makes two restaurant servings. Serve with a side salad.

### Ingredients

1/4 cup yellow onions, finely chopped	8 ozs cream cheese
2 green onions, sliced	1/2 stick butter
1/4 cup sliced mushrooms	1 Tbsp Worcestershire sauce
2 tsp garlic, chopped	1 Tbsp honey
1 tsp oregano	12 ozs chopped, thawed, well-drained spinach
1 tsp salt	2 8-inch pizza pie crusts
1/4 cup white wine	20 ozs shredded provolone or mozzarella cheese
1 tsp olive oil	Cocktail sauce (optional)
12 ozs med Gulf shrimp, peeled	

### Prepare

Sauté yellow and green onions, oregano, salt, mushrooms and garlic in olive oil and white wine until soft.

Add shrimp and cook until shrimp turns a pinkish color. Remove from heat and let cool.

Once cooled, pour into a mixing bowl and add cream cheese, butter, Worcestershire sauce, honey and spinach.

Mix until there are no lumps of cream cheese or butter remaining.

Spread 1 cup of the mixture on each pie crust.

Sprinkle each pie with 10 ozs of shredded provolone or mozzarella cheese.

Bake for 8-10 minutes at 350 degrees until each pie is lightly brown on top (check periodically).

Optional: serve with a side of cocktail sauce.



**COBBLE TIP**

### Worcestershire Sauce

Use a soft cloth to rub Worcestershire sauce on silverware (or any silver for that matter), then rinse and dry. They'll look brand new.

## CLOSE ENCOUNTER

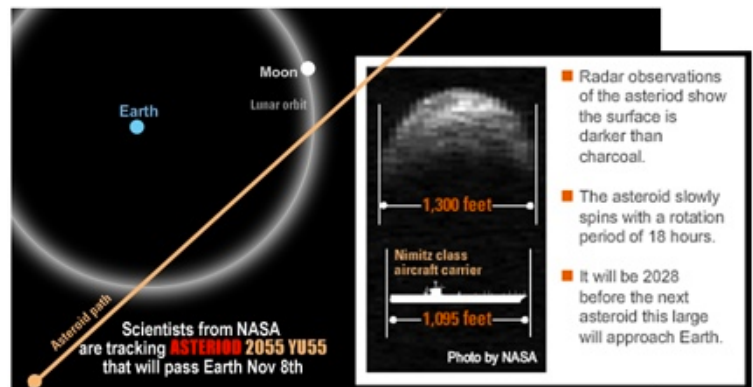
A close encounter of the harmless kind comes **Tues., Nov. 8th** when an aircraft-carrier-size asteroid races past Earth.

The asteroid, dubbed **2005 YU55**, will come within 202,000 miles of

Earth, closer than the moon, before zipping farther into space. Carbon-colored and dark, the asteroid measures some 1,300 feet wide. It will be the closest visit by a space rock this size in more than three decades.

"This is not a potentially hazardous asteroid, just a good opportunity to study one," [National Science Foundation](#) astronomer Thomas Statler says.

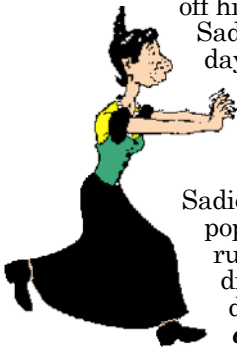

Sadie Hawkins Day. On this day, a race is held and all the single men were given a short head start. If a woman catches her man, he had to marry her.

Sadie Hawkins Day races and events grew in popularity during the course of all Capp's long running cartoon. Sadie Hawkins Day largely died out after 40 years when the cartoon was discontinued. *It can occasionally be seen celebrated on college campuses.*

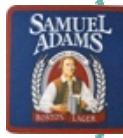
