originally secured a Community Water Quality Improvement Plan Grant funded by DNREC to install a green roof on the farm stand and implement other measures to reduce surface water pollutant loads. After determining that the existing structure could not support a green roof, we obtained approval from DNREC for a revised scope of work to include:



- Building a free standing green roofed structure adjacent to existing Farm Stand
- Reroof the existing Farm Stand with a new thermal efficient roof
- Include rainwater capture systems

Greenways engaged architectural firm Method Design to develop concepts, design and oversee implementation. We worked together on a full construction master plan for the farm stand area that is consistent with our long-term vision for the farm. We propose to implement Phase 1 of this master plan now. This phase will accomplish the revised scope of work, above, and will be funded through the CWQI grant (to be completed by June 4, 2016). More on page 3

Farm'Stand'Renovation


A green roof of a building that is partially or completely covered with vegetation and a growing medium, planted over a waterproofing membrane. It may also include additional layers such as a root barrier and drainage and irrigation systems.

The existing building cannot support the load of a green roof, so a new structure is added to the front of the farm stand. Supported by a new set of V-shaped columns running across the front of the building, a new "eye brow" is constructed above the roof line that supports the extensive green roof system, while also extending the shade profile of the south facing sun. The new eyebrow roof extends beyond the existing barn to form an open market which also allows for expanded programing, function, and bio climatic response.

By upturning the rear portion of the extension, the green roof becomes more visible to the public as they drive by. The punctures in the roof provide depth for plants like ivy to grow down and through the roof, which also highlights the utilization of the roof. The gutters will direct the rain to the rain barrels which will be included in Phase 1. Phase 1 includes the addition of the green roof canopy, replacement of the existing roof, the addition of gutters and rain barrels and some interior renovations. This phase excludes the change in parking area, the change in main entrance, the backside expansion of the existing structure for food processing and storage, and building of a new storage shed.



Apple Brownies

While chocolate brownies will always reign supreme, these apple brownies are a new treat for fall! Filled with fresh apples and bursting with flavor, these bars are as perfect for gettogethers with friends as they are for casual family nights... whatever you do, try these out and see how yummy they are!

you're gonna need

3 large, sweet apples, peeled, cored and chopped (2 1/2-3 cups) ●

1¼ cups all-purpose flour • 1 c sugar • 1/4 c orange juice • 12 tbsps unsalted butter, room temp


 1 lg egg • 1 tbsp lemon juice • 1 tsp cinnamon • 1/2 tsp vanilla extract • 1/2 tsp baking powder • 1/2 tsp salt • 1/4 tsp nutmeg

here's the drill

- ▶ Place chopped apples in a large bowl and pour lemon juice over the top. Toss until all are coated.
- ▶ Preheat oven to 350° F and lightly grease an 8×11-inch baking dish with butter or non-stick spray.
- In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, cinnamon, baking powder, salt and nutmeg and set aside.
- ▶ In a large bowl or mixer, cream together butter and sugar until fluffy and lightened in color.
- ▶ Mix in egg and vanilla extract until incorporated, then mix in orange juice and (gradually) add dry ingredients.
- ▶ Stir until just combined, then fold in chopped apples.
- ▶ Pour mixture into greased baking dish and place in oven.

Bake for 40-45 minutes, or until golden brown.

Remove from oven and let cool, then slice into squares and enjoy!
