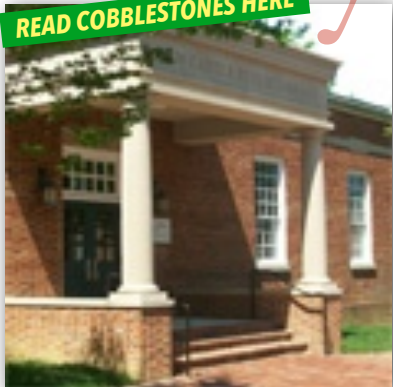

chicken cordon bleu bites

gonna need all this stuff

for the **bites**

1 lb ground chicken, cooked and finely crumbled • 1/4 lb thinly sliced smoked deli ham, finely chopped • 3 tbsp butter • 1/3 c. minced onions • 1 c. + 4 tbsp flour, divided • 1-1/4 c. milk • 2 tsp Dijon mustard • 2 tsp salt • 1/2 tsp black pepper • Pinch of smoked paprika • 3 eggs, beaten • 1-1/2 c.s cornflake crumbs • Oil, for frying

for the **sauce**

2 tbsp butter • 2-1/2 tbsp flour • 1 c. milk • 1/2 c. chicken stock • 2 c.s grated Gruyère or Swiss cheese • 1/2 tsp salt • Pinch of nutmeg



for the **love of making them**

♦ To prepare the bites, place the chicken and ham into a medium-size bowl. Melt the butter in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Add the onions and sauté until translucent. Stir in 4 Tbsp flour and cook for a minute. Add the milk, mustard, salt, pepper, and paprika. Stir and heat until the sauce begins to simmer and has thickened. Fold the sauce into the bowl with the chicken and ham. Spread the mixture out onto a baking sheet and refrigerate until cool and firm, about 30 minutes.

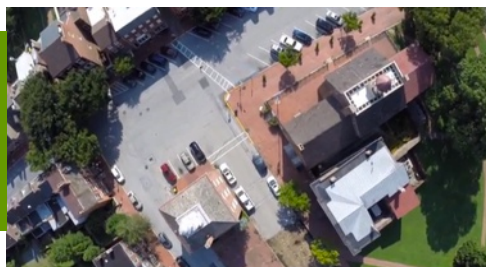
♦ While mixture is cooling, make the dipping sauce. Melt the butter on medium-high heat in a medium saucepan. Add the flour and stir for about a minute. Add the milk and chicken stock and continue to stir while heating. When the sauce has almost begun to simmer and has thickened, add the cheese, salt and nutmeg. Stir until the cheese has melted and sauce is smooth. Hold on very low heat until ready to serve, stirring occasionally.

♦ To bread and cook the bites, heat a deep fryer or Dutch oven with oil to 375°F. Take the cooled mixture by rounded tablespoonfuls and roll into balls. Place them on a clean baking sheet. In separate shallow bowls, place 1 c. flour, eggs, and crumbs. Coat the bites 4-6 at a time with flour and then dip and coat completely with egg. Finally, roll the bites in the bread crumbs, coating completely. Place the bites back onto the baking sheet. Deep-fry the bites in batches of 6-8 at a time for about 3-4 minutes, or until deep-golden brown. Serve with the dipping sauce. **Serves 6-8**

Route 273 Multi-Use Trail Opens in New Castle

The State of Delaware added another line to its network of trails and pathways today, as Secretary Shailen Bhatt, Department of Transportation (DelDOT), Secretary David Small, Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) and President Linda Ratchford, New Castle City Council, cut the ribbon on the Route 273 Multi-Use Trail in the City of New Castle.

The approximately \$1.3 million trail runs along Route 273 (French Town Road and Delaware Street), between the New Castle Farmer's Market and a point near Tenth Street. Within its two-mile length are connections to the New Castle Heritage Trail and the Industrial Track Trail, which will eventually connect the City of New Castle and the City of Wilmington.

"Filling gaps and making connections between previously disconnected routes is a big part of what we do with the First State Trails and Pathways Initiative," said Secretary Bhatt. "By creating connections, we encourage walking and bicycling as healthy and convenient alternatives to automotive travel."

"Delaware has moved from fifth in 2013 to the highest ranked state in 2014 by the League of American Bicyclist Bicycle Friendly America program," said Secretary Small. "Under the Governor's Trails and Pathways Initiative, DelDOT and DNREC, working with local partners, have made trail development a priority through connecting communities and filling gaps in existing trail systems. These amenities create opportunities for recreation, exercise, and connecting with the landscape."

This new trail supports a healthier New Castle by providing walkable/bikeable access to healthy food sources, nearby employers and surrounding communities," said Council President Ratchford. "It connects children to schools and ball fields,

makes it possible for adults to walk or bicycle to nearby farm markets, and provides better access to both historic Penn Farm and Bellanca Airfield."

Currently in project development, planned extensions to the Route 273 Multi-Use Trail would reach west to Churchman's Road and east into Old New Castle.

Governor Markell's First State Trails and Pathways Initiative creates a statewide network of new and enhanced trails and pathways for residents and visitors to enjoy walking, biking, hiking and active living. The initiative has far-reaching advantages – boosting Delaware's economy, benefiting local businesses and promoting the continued growth of the state's recreation and tourism industries. By offering people a place to walk, run, or ride, trails and pathways allow them to connect with the outdoors and encourages healthier, more active lifestyles as well as offering more choices for active transportation.

First State Trails and Pathways Initiative is a partnership led by the Department of Transportation and the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control with regional and local organization and government partners.
