

Roast chicken is a great dish for family dinners and parties. Preparing is as simple as adding in some herbs and roasting in the oven. Here's Julia Child's favorite roast chicken and juicy honey-and-lemonglazed roast chicken.

you'll need

1/4 cup plus 1 tsp honey • 2 tbsp plus 1 tsp fresh lemon juice • 2 tbsp soy sauce • Three 3-pound chickens - Salt 9 large rosemary sprigs • 9 garlic cloves, quartered
1 lemon, cut into 12 wedges

two easy steps

Step 1 Make oven happy at 450°. In a small bowl, combine the honey, lemon juice and soy sauce. Set the chickens on a large rimmed baking sheet and tuck the wing tips underneath. Season the cavities with salt and stuff each one with 3 rosemary sprigs, 3 quartered garlic cloves and 4 lemon wedges. Brush two-thirds of the honey glaze over the chickens and season lightly with salt. Roast in the middle of the oven for 30 minutes.

Step 2 Reduce the oven temperature to 325°. Rotate the chickens in the pan and brush with the remaining glaze. Roast the chickens for about 45 minutes longer, until the juices run clear when the thighs are pierced; turn the pan halfway through roasting. Transfer the chickens to a carving board and let rest for 15 minutes. Carve the chickens and serve.



This easy green bloody mary starts with a mix made from scratch with tomatillos. It's simple to make and comes together in a snap. It's makes a big batch which is perfect for entertaining!

FIXNS'

1 1/2 lb. tomatillos, husked and quartered - 1 c. yellow cherry tomatoes - 3 cucumbers, small and chopped - 2 jalapeños, stem, seeds removed and chopped - 2 cloves garlic, peeled - 1 lime, juiced - 1 tbsp. horseradish - 1 tsp. kosher salt -

1 tsp. -celery seed - 1 1/2 c. vodka - Old bay, for rimming - 6 cooked bacon strips, for garnish - 6 celery sticks, for garnish

LET DO IT

- 1. In a large food processor, add tomatillos, cherry tomatoes, cucumbers, jalapeno, and garlic. Blend until smooth. Add lime juice, horseradish, hot sauce, salt, celery seed, and a few cranks of pepper. Blend again until combined.
- 2. Mix tomatillo mixture and vodka in a large pitcher.
- 3. Place old bay on a small, shallow plate. Rim 4 glasses with a lime wedge then dip rims into old bay.
- 4. Divide bloody marys between glasses and garnish with a strip of bacon, celery stick, and a lime wedge.

Parks

Sculptures by Parks are usually naturalistic and convey gestures of subtle beauty and tranquility. They seek to embody universal human values usually through uplifting, confident, and serene poses. Many sculptures seen in public spaces in and around New Castle County, Delaware were created by Parks, including The Brandywine River Museum's Boy with Hawk; The Student at the Newark Free Library; Father and Son in Spencer's Plaza between King and French Street in Wilmington; Apprentice near the

> Brandywine River in H. Fletcher Brown Memorial Park; and the sculpture of Governor Russell Peterson near the **Riverfront Nature** Center. He is perhaps best known nationally for his large Madonna sculptures, the first of which, Our Lady of Peace, was displayed in Rodney

Square before traveling to its current home in Santa Clara, California. A second large Madonna is now in Indiana at St. John's Passion Church and a third Madonna can be seen in New Castle, at Holy Spirit Catholic Church.

There are many Charles Parks works in New Castle, at the Senior Center, Library and at the Court House Museum, which has a whole exhibit room of his statues and sculptures. They have several presidents, a minute man, a boy scout (modeled after Gerald Ford when he was a scout) and a few others on the second floor exhibit room. Visit Tues-Sat 10-4:30 and Sunday 1:30-4:30.


