Two Lafayette authorities

Julien Icher, a young man from Carcassonne, France, spent a morning last week exploring Delaware's French history with W3R's Kim Burdick who lives at the Hale Byrnes House on old Route 7, where Lafayette turned 20 on September 6, 1777.

Icher, age 25, is the founder of The Lafayette Trail project, a Franco-American endeavor mapping Lafayette's farewell tour across 24 states from 1824 to 1825. So far, he's put more than 9,000 miles on

his car in the past four months as he retraces Lafavette's footsteps. "My primary point is to accurately see these places Lafayette went. It will be my mission to track them down," Icher said, "This is a token of friendship between France and America." see page 5

16 frozen Italian meatballs - 1 can refrigerated crescent dinner rolls 1 cup shredded mozzarella - ½ cup tomato basil pasta sauce 2 tbsp butter, melted - 1 tsp Italian seasoning - 1/2 tsp garlic powder 2 tbsp grated parmesan

let's make a batch

Oven happy at 350°F. Line large cookie sheet with parchment paper.

- Make meatballs in microwave as directed on package; set aside to cool slightly. Unroll and separate dough into 2 long rectangles. Place on cookie sheet 1 inch apart. Firmly press edges and perforations to seal.
- Press each dough sheet into 14x4-inch rectangle.
- Sprinkle mozzarella cheese down center of both pieces of dough. Space 8 meatballs evenly over cheese on each piece of dough. Spoon pasta sauce over meatballs. Press ends together to seal.
- Starting from one end, stretch and pull both sides of dough up and between each meatball; press together to seal.
- With table knife, score dough between meatballs.
- In small bowl, mix melted butter, Italian seasoning and garlic powder. Brush evenly over dough. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.
- Bake 26 to 30 minutes or until dough is deep golden brown and meatballs are hot in center (at least 165°F). Serve with additional warmed pasta sauce for dipping. WATCH THE <u>VIDEO</u>
