**6** Father John Carroll was appointed as the first Roman Catholic bishop in the US. 1789, **Abraham Lincoln** elected President. 1860 and a year later **Jefferson Davis** was elected as the president of the Confederacy. **William C. 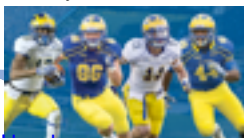

## gather up

6 tbsp unsalted butter • 4 lbs Pink Lady and/or Granny Smith apples, peeled, cored, cut into 1-inch pieces •  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup (packed) dark brown sugar • 3 tbsp all-purpose flour • 1 tsp finely grated lemon zest • 2 tbsp fresh lemon juice • 1 tbsp vanilla extract  
2 tps ground cinnamon • 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch piece ginger, peeled, finely grated •  $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp kosher salt • 1 pkg frozen puff pastry, thawed, cut into irregular 1-inch pieces  
Granulated sugar (for sprinkling) 2 pints vanilla ice cream

## fixn' the goodness

Crank up your oven to 425°. Cook butter in a small saucepan over medium, swirling often, until bubbling and golden, about 5 minutes; set aside. Toss apples, brown sugar, flour, lemon zest, lemon juice, vanilla extract, cinnamon, ginger, and salt in a large bowl. Transfer to a shallow 3-quart baking dish. Drizzle all but 2 tbsp. brown butter over apples. Top with pieces of puff pastry, then brush pastry with remaining brown butter. Sprinkle with granulated sugar. Bake until pastry is puffed and golden around edges, 25-30 minutes. Reduce temperature to 350° and bake until juices are thick and bubbling and pastry is brown all over, 30-35 minutes longer. Using a spoon, press pastry down into warm juices (but don't submerge); let cool slightly. Serve warm with ice cream.

This **Saturday** we pay respect to our veterans for their contribution to the safety and security of our country and its citizens. In honor of these heroes, we've put together a list of 10 interesting facts you may not have known about the holiday.

- Veterans Day is always observed on November 11 and is both a state and a federal holiday.
- The day was first called Armistice Day and was established on November 11, 1919. This date was the first anniversary of the ending of World War I.
- As a result of lobbying by veterans' service organizations, Armistice Day was changed to Veterans Day in 1954. President Eisenhower signed the legislation. The holiday became a day to honor *all* of America's veterans.
- President Eisenhower established the **Veterans Day National Committee**. Consisting of leaders of veterans' groups, the committee meets several times a year in Washington, D.C. and plans Veterans Day activities and events that honor U.S. veterans. The committee is also dedicated to Veterans Day education, ensuring that the younger generations understand the importance and significance of the day.
- France, Britain, Canada, and Australia also honor World War I and II veterans on or near November 11.
- Every year on Veterans Day, at exactly 11 a.m., a wreath-laying ceremony is held at the Tomb of the Unknowns in the Arlington National Cemetery. Here is a video of President Obama participating in the 2012 ceremony:
- 7. In 1968, Veterans Day was changed to the fourth Monday in October. It was changed back to November 11 in 1975 by President Ford.

## SCRAPPLE

also known by the Pennsylvania Dutch name "pon haus", it is

traditionally a mush of pork scraps and

trimmings combined with cornmeal, wheat

flour and spices. The spices may include, but are not limited to: sage, thyme,

savory and black pepper. The mush is then formed

into a semi-solid loaf, sliced and pan-fried.

Some of us like it thin and crisp while others prefer thick and mushy. Some use toppings that include ketchup and maple syrup - it's plain in the CobbleKitchen!

Scrapple is arguably the first pork food invented in America. The immediate ancestor of scrapple was the Low German dish called panhas, which was adapted to make use of locally available ingredients and, in parts of Pennsylvania, it is still called Pannhaas, panhoss, ponhoss or pannhas.

It was in the 17th and 18th centuries that the first recipes for scrapple were created by Dutch colonists who settled near Philadelphia and Chester County, Pennsylvania. Hence the origin of its discovery, it is strongly associated with rural areas surrounding Philadelphia, Baltimore, Washington D.C., eastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland, Delaware, eastern Virginia and the Delmarva Peninsula.
