Trustee tenure ending

Elected in 2003 as a member of the New Castle Trustees of the Common, **Carlo Viola** ends his 12-year term this month. Trustee Michael Alfree took time to recount the historical timeline from the March 1922 election of James T. Morrison to Clay Bridgewater's term, when Carlo was elected. Although he has served on several committees, he was quickly drawn to the Property Maintenance Committee and the Library Board, where he continues to put his energy. Even before he was elected he had helped to support a successful effort to restore the old hangar and lease the building to a non-profit called Friends of Bellanca Airfield. Interest continues to grow and, working together, we saved an important piece of New Castle history that might otherwise have vanished.

In 2008, he was instrumental in getting support from other members of the Board to move forward with a major project to expand, restore and modernize our Library. The project cost \$6.2 million and took 2 years but the outcome was worth the effort. Once underway, Carlo chaired both the Capital and Building committees.

Inspired by the success of the Library project, the Board turned its attention to the issues at Penn Farm. Mike Alfree coined the phrase "*Crown Jewel of the Common*". Now that the project is well underway, Trustees and New Castilians alike are enjoying the progress. Finally, he laments the fact that in the last 12 years, we and other community organizations have been unable to make any progress in saving the Banks Building. As the only remaining structure at what was once a bustling port, it deserves to be restored, honored and used to tell the story that goes with the building.

Carlo plans to file as a candidate for re-election as soon as a vacancy is declared.

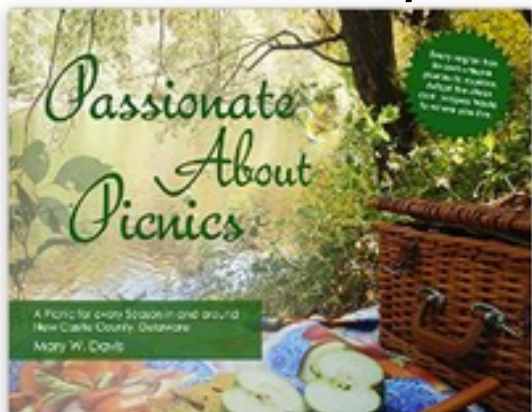

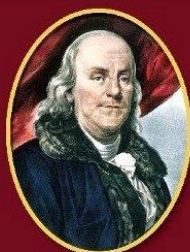

the Delicious Crunch of Onion Rings sans the grease

Ingredients

- 1 cup flour
- 3 red onions
- 3 eggs
- 3 tbsps milk
- 2 cups breadcrumbs
- 1 tbsp Old Bay
- ½ tsp garlic powder



Directions

Crank up oven to 450°

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and spray with cooking spray.

Beat eggs and milk in a small mixing bowl.

Combine flour, salt, Old Bay, and garlic powder in a second bowl.

Place breadcrumbs in a third bowl. *Lotta bowls going on here!*

Peel away outer layer of onions and chop of the top and bottom. Then chop your onions horizontally in 1/2 inch increments. Then separate the layers of onions so that they begin to look like rings.

Take each onion ring and first dip it into the mixing bowl with the flour. Then dip it in the bowl containing your eggs and milk.

Dip the same onion ring into the bowl of breadcrumbs. *Same bowls here!*

Place your battered onion ring on your baking tray.

Repeat steps 7 and 8 until all of your onion rings are battered and on the baking sheet. Then spray your completed onion rings with a bit more cooking spray.

Bake onion rings for 25 minutes or until they are golden brown.

One-by-one they faded away; the sparse old men who I once saw selling bright red poppies on street corners and in store doorways in the week leading up to Armistice Day. They stood there quietly, bent over in misshapen overcoats, often with a scraggle of whiskers which didn't quite cover the lines in their face which seemed to me -- a ten year-old boy, in 1953 -- the visible scars of their deeply-worn lives. I remember that the poppies were lined up in rows, neatly pinned to a square of brown cardboard, somehow reminiscent of the once-ordered ranks of fallen warriors. The crimson blossoms, each with its own silver pin, seemed like a row of little red badges, intended for adults to pin to their lapel, a paper flower that carried the arid fragrance of distant canons and the "Great War" that the aged veterans had somehow managed to survive. Now they're gone, every last one of them; the entire cadre of bright-faced boys who, in 1917, had departed from the Wilmington train station on their long journey to that bitter conflagration that was called "the war to end all wars." It makes me sad to know that they're no longer here; that I can't pause on a street corner in my old home town and buy a single poppy, a crimson one, from even one of them.

Take a look at this list and then go rummage through your fridge.



- ✓ Hot sauce stays fresh up to 3 years without refrigeration.
- ✓ Potatoes should be stored in paper bags in cool, dry pantries.
- ✓ Onions do best in dry, ventilated areas. Keep them away from potatoes.
- ✓ Like onions, garlic is just fine in a dry, ventilated area of the pantry.
- ✓ Basil absorbs fridge smells, so it is best to keep your fresh basil in a cup or vase of water on the counter.
- ✓ Your avocado won't ripen? That's because it's in the fridge. On the counter will make it ripen much faster.
- ✓ Putting berries in the fridge can make them rot much faster due to moisture. Bread is best when kept at room temperature in a sealed plastic bag. Storing bread in the fridge speeds up the dehydration process and makes it go stale faster.

- ✓ You might have heard that keeping batteries in the fridge can make them last longer. This is false. Extreme cold can actually make them last for a shorter period of time.
- ✓ Storing tomatoes in the fridge can alter their flavor and make them rot faster. Keeping them on the counter in a bowl is your best bet.
- ✓ Keep coffee out of the fridge and in a dry, air-tight container in the cupboard.
- ✓ Most squash, especially those with thicker skin, do well for up to a couple months in the pantry.
- ✓ Honey is the only food that doesn't spoil and it doesn't need to be refrigerated.
- ✓ Most cakes don't need refrigeration. If it's unfrosted or has a buttercream or ganache frosting, it's fine to store it in an airtight container for around three days.
- ✓ Uncut melons do best on the counter or in a dry pantry.
- ✓ Bananas should be hung on a banana hook on the counter.
- ✓ Ketchup and mustard can be kept in the cabinet for around a month without refrigeration.
- ✓ Peanut butter doesn't need to be refrigerated..
- ✓ Cooking oils can be kept in the pantry, with the exception of nut oils.
- ✓ Apples, peaches, nectarines and pears can be kept in a basket in your pantry and will last around a week

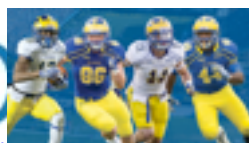
