DelDOT announces that Eastern Highway Specialists, Inc. will be replacing the railroad crossing at Route 9/River Road between Grantham Lane and Army Creek, south of New Castle beginning at 7 a.m. on Saturday, November 8. The repair work is expected to be completed by midnight on Saturday, November 22, pending weather or other unforeseen circumstances. Detour Northbound Route 9/River Road onto Hamburg Road to U.S. Route 13 northbound onto New Castle Frenchtown Road to Washington Street and return to Route 9/River Road. Detour Southbound Route 9/River Road onto Washington Street to New Castle Frenchtown Road to U.S. Route 13 southbound to Hamburg Road and back to Route 9/River Road. Message boards will be posted in advance advising motorists of the upcoming closure.



NGREDIENTS

Change Servings


- ♦1 1/4 cs all-purpose flour
- ♦1/4 c white sugar
- →2 tsps baking powder
- ♦1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp ground nutmeg
- ♦1 c milk
- ♦1/2 c pumpkin puree
- ◆1 egg, beaten
- ◆1 tbsp vegetable oil

DIRECTIONS

- Sift flour, sugar, baking powder, cinnamon, and nutmeg together in a bowl.
- Whisk milk, pumpkin, egg, and oil together in a bowl. Pour milk mixture into flour mixture and stir until just moistened. Batter will be slightly lumpy.
- Heat a lightly oiled griddle over medium-high heat to 350°
- Drop batter by large spoonfuls onto the griddle and cook until bubbles form and the edges are dry, 1 to 3 minutes. Flip and cook until browned on the other side, about 1 minute more. Repeat with remaining batter.

Make an X on the flat side of the shells with a sharp knife. Wear leather gloves, because the nuts are slippery. Place the nuts in a single


layer in a glass baking dish, cover with waxed paper, and

While the nuts are still warm, use a small sharp knife to peel off the shells and as much of the inner brown skins as you can. Work patiently to avoid bloodshed (your own).

Before adding the nuts to stuffing or other dishes, sauté them in 1 tablespoon butter until golden brown




