falls on the second Monday in November this year. The federal holiday is celebrated every year on Nov. 11, regardless of the day of the week it falls on.

First recognized as Armistice Day in 1919, Veterans Day marks the date when Germany and the allies signed a 1918 agreement to cease World War I hostilities. The fighting ceased on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, according to the Department of Veterans Affairs.

President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed Nov. 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day, saying: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory." In 1938, Congress passed a law to mark Nov. 11 as a legal holiday. In 1954, President Dwight Eisenhower signed a law that changed the name to its current form. While the holiday was celebrated on the fourth Monday of October for much of the 1970s, President Gerald Ford signed a bill that returned the observance to Nov. 11 beginning in 1978.

Today, Veterans Day celebrates all those who served honorably in the military, whether in war or peace, whereas Memorial Day is for remembering and honoring military personnel who died in the service of their country.

cranberries.

gonna need

Nonstick vegetable oil spray • 1 Tbsp. plus 1½ tsp. unflavored powdered gelatin • 1½ lb. fresh (or frozen, thawed) cranberries 4 cardamom pods, lightly crushed • 3 fresh bay leaves • Pinch of kosher salt • 1 cup unsweetened cranberry juice or water • 1½ cups plus 3 Tbsp. Sugar • 2 2x1" strips orange zest, very thinly sliced lengthwise

preparation

Lightly coat a 4-cup mold or Bundt pan with nonstick spray. Stir gelatin and ½ cup warm water in a small bowl and let sit 10 minutes. Set 2 Tbsp. cranberries aside for serving. Bring cardamom, bay leaves salt, cranberry juice, 1½ cups sugar, and remaining cranberries to a boil in a large saucepan, stirring to dissolve sugar. Continue to cook, stirring often and reducing heat as needed to avoid scorching, until cranberries burst and juices begin to look syrupy, 10–12 minutes. Remove from heat and pick out cardamom and bay leaves; discard. Stir in gelatin mixture (gelatin should be completely dissolved). Slowly pour cranberry mixture into mold. Chill until completely set, at least 12 hours.

To serve, dip mold in a bowl of warm water and hold 30 seconds. Remove and place a platter upside down over top of mold. Invert jelly onto platter.

Just before serving, toss orange zest, remaining 2 Tbsp. cranberries, and remaining 3 Tbsp. sugar in a small bowl to coat. Scatter over jelly. **Do Ahead:** Jelly (without sugared cranberries and zest) can be made 2 days ahead. Keep chilled.

One-by-one they faded away; the sparse old men who I once saw selling bright red poppies on street corners and in store doorways in the week leading up to Armistice Day. They stood there quietly, bent over in misshapen overcoats, often with a straggle of whiskers which didn't quite cover the lines in their face which



seemed to me — a ten year-old boy, in 1953 — the visible scars of their deeply-worn lives. I remember that the poppies were lined up in rows, neatly pinned to a square of brown cardboard, somehow reminiscent of the once-ordered ranks of fallen warriors. The crimson blossoms, each with its own silver pin, seemed like a row of little red badges, intended for adults to pin to their lapel, a paper flower that carried the arid fragrance of distant cannons and the "Great War" that the aged veterans had somehow managed to survive. Now they're gone, every last one of them; the entire cadre of bright-faced boys who, in 1917, had departed from the Wilmington train station on their long journey to that bitter conflagration that was called "the war to end all wars." It makes me sad to know that they're no longer here; that I can't pause on a street corner in my old home town and buy a single poppy, a crimson one, from even one of them.


