12 The first flying trapeze act was performed by **Jules Leotard** in Paris. He was also the designer of the garment that is named after him. 1859, **William Heffelfinger** became the first professional football player when he was paid a \$500 bonus. 1892, The first **Sunday football game** was played in Phila. 1933, **Ellis Island**, the immigration station in New York Harbor, closed after processing more than 20 million immigrants since 1892. 1954, **John Lennon's** ♡ (Just Like) Starting Over, was released. 1980, The **space shuttle Columbia** was launched for the 2nd time. This was the first time a space vehicle was used more than once. 1981

13 **Ben Franklin** wrote a letter to a friend in which he said, "In this world nothing can be said to be certain, except death and taxes." 1789, **Johann George Lehner**, a Viennese butcher, invented a recipe and called it the "frankfurter." 1805, **Mt Rainier** in Washington State erupts. 1843, The **Holland Tunnel** under the Hudson River opens to the public, connecting NYC and New Jersey. 1927, The first artificial snow was produced by **Vincent J. Schaefer** over Mt. Greylock, MA. 1946, VP **Spiro Agnew** calls TV executives "impudent snobs" 1970, **Li'l Abner** by Al Capp appeared in newspapers for the last time. 1977

14 The **first streetcar** went into operation 1832, Herman Melville's novel **Moby Dick** was first published. 1851, **Charles J.**

Guiteau's trial began for the assassination of President Garfield. Guiteau was convicted and hanged the following year. 1881, **Leonard Bernstein** replaced Bruno Walter as conductor of the NY Philharmonic, 1943, **Yale University** goes Co-ed. 1968, **Scotchguard** patented. 1973, ♡ **Dirty Dancing** movie soundtrack was the number one album. 1987

15 The Continental Congress approves the **Articles of Confederation**. 1777, Explorer **Zebulon Pike** spotted the mountaintop that became known as Pikes Peak. 1806, A patent was granted to **King C. Gillette** for a safety 'razor'. 1904, ♡ **Love Me Tender**, the first **Elvis Presley** film, premiered. 1956, **Richard Petty** drove in the final race of his 35-year career. 1992

16 **Napoleon Guerin** patented the cork life preserver. 1841, **Gen. William T. Sherman** and his troops began their "March to the Sea". 1864, **Lucy** first held a football for **Charlie Brown**. 1952, ♡ **Sixteen Tons** became the fastest-selling record in history. 1955, **Dr. Samuel Sheppard** was acquitted in his second trial of charges he had murdered his pregnant wife, Marilyn. 1966

17 Congress held its first session in the partially completed **Capitol building**. 1800, **US Post Office** issued a 1-cent carrier stamp. 1851, The **first underwater submarine** journey was taken, from Southampton, England, to the Isle of Wight. 1904, The **'Heidi Game'** happened. The Jets/Raiders football game was cut off to begin a family show ("Heidi") on NBC. TV viewers missed Oakland's two touchdowns (in nine seconds) to win the game 43-32. NBC was flooded with calls and the concept of

program delay was instituted immediately by the networks. 1968

18 **Capt. Nathaniel Palmer** became the first American to sight the continent of Antarctica. 1820, **Samuel L. Clemens** published "**The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County**" under the pen name Mark Twain in the NY Saturday Press. 1865, US and Canada adopted a system of **standard time zones**. 1883, **Chuck Connors** (Los Angeles Angels-the Cubs top farm club) became the first player to oppose the major league draft. Connors later became the star of the television show **The Rifleman**. 1951, Apollo 12 astronauts **Charles "Pete" Conrad Jr.** and **Alan L. Bean** landed on the lunar surface during the second manned mission to the moon. 1969

CRANBERRY SAUCE



with **PINOT** and **FIGS**

INGREDIENTS

1 ½ cups pinot noir • 12 dried figs, halved if small, quartered if large • 2 tbsp high-quality balsamic vinegar

Base Cranberry Sauce:

2 tbsp canola oil • 1 tbsp grated ginger • 1 large shallot, finely diced • ¾ cup brown sugar • ½ cup honey • ¼ cup orange juice • ½ cup granulated sugar • Pinch kosher salt • 1 lb fresh or frozen cranberries

DIRECTIONS

Bring the wine to a simmer in a small saucepan. Remove from the heat, add the figs and let soak until soft, about 30 minutes. Drain, and add the chopped figs to the Base Cranberry Sauce and cook another minute or so. Stir in the balsamic vinegar, and, if desired, stir some of the soaking liquid into the finished sauce.

Base Cranberry Sauce

Heat the canola oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the ginger and shallots and cook, stirring, until soft and fragrant, about 3 minutes. Stir in the brown sugar, honey, orange juice, 1/4 cup granulated sugar, and salt. Cook, stirring, until sugar dissolves and mixture is nice and bubbly.

Add half the cranberries and cook, stirring occasionally, until the cranberries pop and the mixture thickens, about 5 minutes. Add the remaining cranberries and cook another 5 minutes or so.



CREAMY Chocolate Raspberry *tini*

1 1/2 oz vanilla vodka
1 oz Godiva chocolate liqueur
1 oz Chambord
1 oz half-n-half

Fill a cocktail shaker halfway with ice. Pour in all ingredients, and shake until chilled. Rim a martini glass with pink sugar (you can make your own pink sugar by mixing sugar with a couple drops of red food coloring). Strain the mixture into the glass, and serve.

Officers handle **three heroin overdoses** within the city limits. Two resulted in death.

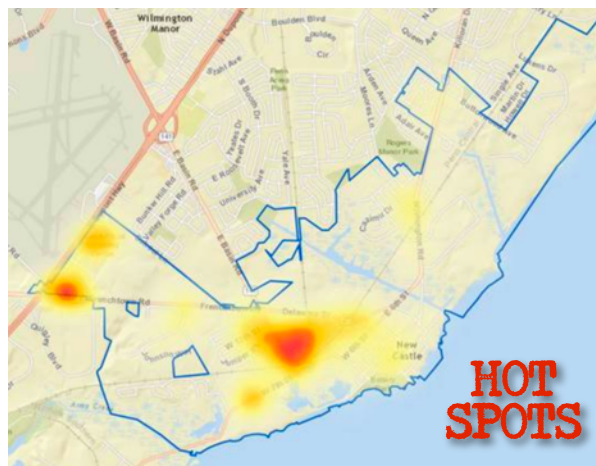
Officers handle **a road rage incident** where a handgun was displayed. An arrest was made and the defendant was ordered to surrender her weapons.

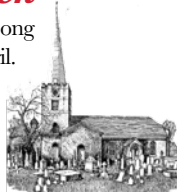
