Bayshore Byway introduced

During the last City Council meeting, Tuesday past, **Steve Borleske**, presented an update of the State's Bayshore initiative and the newly launched Delaware Bayshore Byway including the new Branding program. The Delaware Bayshore, extending along the Delaware River and Bay from New Castle to Lewes, is widely recognized as an area of global ecological significance. Its expansive coastal marshes, sandy shoreline, forests, fields, and agricultural lands provide habitat for more than 400 species of birds and other wildlife. The Nature Conservancy has called the Delaware Bayshore, "one of the earth's most important stopovers for migratory birds." Nearly 120,000 acres of Bayshore lands are already protected as national wildlife refuges, state wildlife areas, state parks, national estuarine research reserves, private conservation areas, agricultural preserves and cultural heritage sites throughout the area. The newly launched Bayshore Byway, which starts in New Castle and ends just south of Dover (with plans for an extension to Lewes), serves as the gateway to the Bayshore area. **For information** contact Ann Gravatt, DelDOT Planning Supervisor, Byway Program, at 302-760-2254, Ann.Gravatt@state.de.us or visit the Delaware Bayshore Byway website at www.byways.deldot.gov. **More Bayshore Byway in future editions.**

15 The Continental Congress approves the **Articles of Confederation**. 1777, Explorer **Zebulon Pike** spotted the mountaintop that became known as Pikes Peak. 1806, A patent was granted to **King C. Gillette** for a safety 'razor'. 1904, **Love Me Tender**, the first **Elvis Presley** film, premiered. 1956, **Richard Petty** drove in the final race of his 35-year career. 1992

16 **Napoleon Guerin** patented the cork life preserver. 1841, **Gen. William T. Sherman** and his troops began their "March to the Sea". 1864, **Lucy** first held a football for **Charlie Brown**. 1952, **Sixteen Tons** became the fastest-selling record in history. 1955, **Dr. Samuel Sheppard** was acquitted in his second trial of charges he had murdered his wife, Marilyn. 1966

17 Congress held its first session in the partially completed **Capitol building**. 1800, **US Post Office** issued a 1-cent carrier stamp. 1851, The **first underwater submarine** journey was taken, from Southampton, England, to the Isle of Wight. 1904, The **'Heidi Game'** happened. Steak Diane

Supposedly named for the Roman goddess of the hunt, Diana (or Diane) style was originally a way of serving venison.

Through the years, though, the preparation has come to mean sautéing thinly sliced or pounded filet mignon in butter and then flambeing and basting it in a rich Cognac sauce.



on your counter ya need

1 quart beef stock
Four 6 to 8-ounce filet mignons
1 tsp kosher salt
1 tsp freshly cracked black pepper
4 tbsps butter
2 tbsps extra-virgin olive oil
3 cups thinly sliced cremini mushrooms
2 shallots, sliced
4 cloves garlic, minced
1/2 cup brandy
1/2 cup dry red wine
1 tbsp Dijon mustard
1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce

here's how to do

Add the beef stock to a saucepan and reduce over medium-high heat to 1/2 cup, about 1 hour.

Sprinkle the steaks on both sides with the salt and pepper. In a large skillet or cast-iron pan over medium-high heat, heat 2 tbsps of the butter and the olive oil. When the butter has melted and the oil

shimmers, add the steaks. Brown the steaks on both sides, 3 minutes per side. Transfer the steaks to a plate and set aside, lightly covered with foil.

Add the mushrooms and shallots to the pan and cook for 2 minutes, stirring frequently, adding oil if needed. Add the garlic. When the garlic is lightly colored, add the brandy (be careful, it can ignite). Add the wine, mustard, Worcestershire and the reduced beef stock. Simmer for 2 to 3 minutes more. Return the steaks to the pan and finish cooking them to the desired temperature, 2 to 4 minutes, depending upon the size of the filets and desired temperature/doneness. For medium-rare, cook to 135 degrees F on an instant-read thermometer. Add the remaining 2 tbsps butter to the sauce to melt.

To serve, place a steak on each plate and pour the sauce over the steak. - courtesy of Guy Fieri

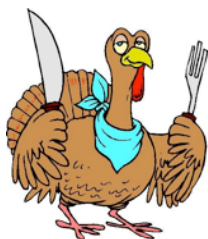

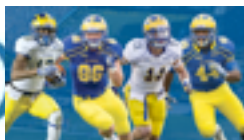
