Senate leader

Sen. David McBride, D-Hawk's Nest, will likely serve as the next President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

• Democrats in the chamber nominated

- McBride after a meeting Wednesday
- night. He has served in the General Assembly since 1978, and has served as majority leader since 2012.

The "Pro Tem" is the highest-ranking member of the Senate and is responsible for setting the chamber's agenda and handing out committee assignments. The position is elected by the full chamber, but Democrats hold a narrow 11-10 majority over Republicans —

meaning McBride will likely win the vote.

If elected, McBride will replace Patricia Blevins, D-Elsmere, who lost her re-election bid. Also chosen to promote were Sen. Margaret Rose Henry, D-Wilmington East, from majority whip to majority

leader, replacing McBride. Sen. Nicole Poore, D-New Castle, chosen to fill Henry's job as majority whip.

Crispy yet tender roasted sweet potatoes, glazed with a maple thyme butter.

for potatoes

3 lbs. sweet potatoes, peeled, small ends trimmed, cut into 1/2" slices 2 T. canola oil • sea salt freshly ground black pepper

for glaze

1/4 c. maple syrup • 2 tbsp. melted butter • 2 tsp. chopped fresh thyme *instructions*

- Toss sweet potato slices in a large bowl with oil, 1t. sea salt, and 1/4t. freshly ground black pepper until
 potatoes are coated in oil and spices.
- 2. Line a rimmed baking sheet with foil, and spray with cooking spray.
- 3. Arrange potatoes in a single layer on the baking sheet (I put the largest, fattest slices on the corners and along the edges, since that is where the heat concentrates.)
- 4. Cover tightly with foil.
- 5. Place on middle rack of a cold oven.
- 6. Turn oven to 425°, and roast for 30 minutes.

While potatoes are roasting, prepare the glaze

- 1. Whisk maple syrup, melted butter and thyme together.
- Remove baking sheet from oven, and CAREFULLY remove top piece of foil. (The steam will come rolling out, so be CAREFUL!) Return pan to oven, and roast potatoes, uncovered, until bottom edges of potatoes are golden brown. This took me only 15 minutes, but your oven may vary.
- 3. Using a pastry brush, brush the potato slices with the glaze.
- 4. Now carefully turn the potato slices over using a thin bladed spatula, and baste the other side as well.
- 5. Return potatoes to the oven and continue to roast an additional 15 minutes or so (your oven may take longer) until bottom edges of potatoes are golden brown. Let cool for 10 minutes, and serve.
- These potatoes can be served without the glaze. The roasting method still works well, if you only use oil, salt, and pepper

On **Saturday, December 10th**, the Westfield Chorale, from Westfield NJ, will return for the second year to perform for New Castle's *Spirit* of *Christmas* celebration. The performance, which will be held at 1:30 at the **New Castle United Methodist Church**, includes many of the Christmas classics such as *Do You Hear What I Hear, Carol of the Bells*, and Fred Waring's beloved '*Twas the Night Before Christmas*. In addition to the choral works, the concert includes Christmas readings as well as carols for the audience to sing along.

This is actually the 29th year the Chorale has performed together, having started back in 1987, when they were students at Westfield High School. Under the direction of their choral director, Bill Mathews, the program became a Westfield tradition, bringing in the Christmas season for 27 years at the First Baptist Church of Westfield, where Mr. Mathews was also Minister of Music. After he was appointed Organist and Choir Director at New Castle United Methodist, he invited the group to last year's "Spirit of Christmas" celebration, and they joyously accepted. The singers will be traveling from New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Maryland, and Virginia to join with their friends in this annual celebration.

There is no charge for the concert.

It is a gift from the Church and the Chorale to the people of New Castle. New Castle United Methodist is located at 510 Delaware Street, in between 5th and 6th Streets.

Sloping for ramps and modification of adjacent areas for smooth transitions to ramps will be required as will detectable warning surfaces (truncated dome blocks). Upon completion, all ramps installed or renovated shall be in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements and guidelines. The second is the placement of three storm manholes and the removal and replacement of one inlet over and near existing storm sewers, the installing of new reinforced concrete pipe, and capping and filling sections of old pipe to be abandoned in Delaware Street. A traffic control plan and traffic control during construction will be required. The third involves pavement milling and overlay, box out and patching, new curb and curb repair, new concrete valley gutter and replacement of existing valley gutter, raising of existing inlet, maintenance of traffic, and painting and striping at numerous locations within New Castle.

Bidding documents may be obtained during normal business hours at the City Administration Building, 220 Delaware Street, New Castle. A Pre-Bid Meeting will be held on Wednesday, November 9, 2016 at 11:00 a.m. at

Town Hall, 201 Delaware Street, New Castle. Attendance at this meeting is mandatory for all prospective bidders and will be a prerequisite for submitting a bid.


