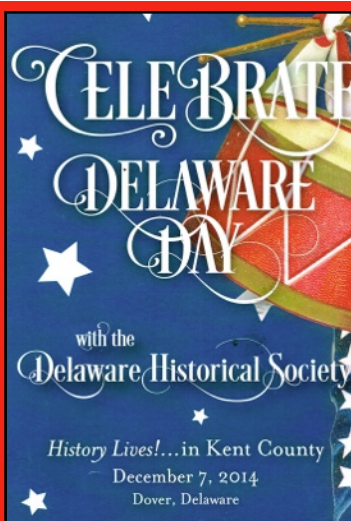

1. 4 large beets (2 1/2 pounds)
2. 5 thyme sprigs
3. 1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling
4. Salt and freshly ground pepper
5. 1/4 cup apple-cider vinegar
6. 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
7. 3 tablespoons prepared horseradish
8. 1/3 cup salted pistachios, chopped
9. 1 green apple, thinly sliced

- Preheat the oven to 375°.
- In a baking dish, lightly drizzle the beets and thyme with olive oil. Season with salt and pepper. Cover with foil and roast until the beets are tender, about 1 hour and 45 minutes. Let cool, then peel the beets and cut them into 3/4-inch dice.
- In a large bowl, whisk the vinegar with the mustard. Whisk in the remaining 1/2 cup of oil until emulsified. Add the horseradish and season with salt and pepper; toss with the beets and pistachios. Transfer the beets to a platter, top with the apple and serve.

This fruity punch will keep a large group warm and happy.



HOT Gin PUNCH

- 24 oz Your Favorite Gin
- 24 oz Madeira wine
- 6 Lemon twists
- 1 Orange slice
- 3 large chunks Pineapple
- 3 oz Honey
- 1 oz Fresh lemon juice
- 3 Cloves
- 1 pinch Ground nutmeg
- 1 tsp Ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon Brown sugar

Garnish Orange slices & cloves

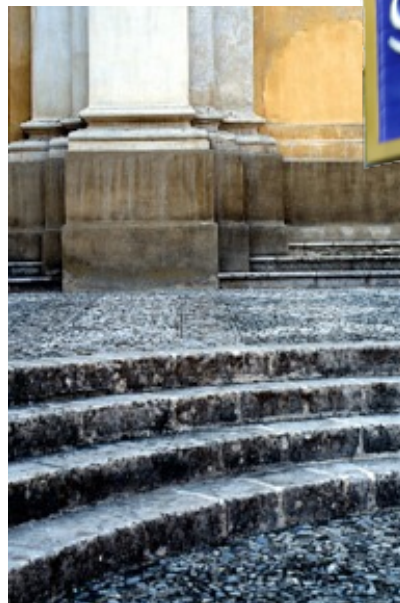

Barrett's Chapel

The patriots who signed our Declaration of Independence and Constitution are honored throughout the United States. The gravestone for Caesar Rodney in Dover is probably not where his remains lie. George Read of New Castle lived a full and long life, as demonstrated on his classical marker. Thomas McKean moved to Philadelphia and is buried with his family in Laurel Hill Cemetery.



This place, DELMARVA, is real and imaginary, physical and intangible, filled with both a living population and thousands of reminders of the dead. Delaware, with exposure on the Atlantic Ocean, plus a navigable river flowing past Sussex, Kent, and New Castle counties, lies completely within the Peninsula. Nine Maryland counties, plus two in Virginia, will be included in my focus, the so-called "Eastern Shore" of the Chesapeake Bay.

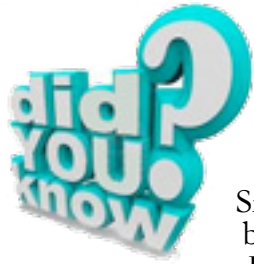
