## Thanks to the people of **New Castle, Area Churches, and Businesses**

On October 13th, we had the most successful NC CROP Walk in our 29 years. The final count for about 130 walkers, who spent just a few short hours, was \$14,932. 25% of this will go to The Emanuel Dining Room in Wilmington, and the Food Bank of Delaware in Newark. The rest goes to needy places all over the USA and the World. Many thanks to those who walked from Asbury Methodist, NCU Methodist, NC Presbyterian, Rivercross Fellowship, Summit Bridge Evangelical, Corporate Sponsors, Swanwyck Garden Club, WSFS, and Public Walk-ins. Included in the totals was \$2,390 given on line through the Internet. Everyone (including the dogs) had a fun time, and by the day of our New Castle Walk, more than 75,000 people had participated in CROP Hunger Walks across 46 states in the USA. We hope that, if you did not make it this year, you will be able to either walk, or sponsor some who does walk, next year.






