

- 1. 4 large beets (2 1/2 pounds)
- 2. 5 thyme sprigs
- 3. 1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling
- 4. Salt and freshly ground pepper
- 5. 1/4 cup apple-cider vinegar
- 6. 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 7. 3 tablespoons prepared horseradish
- 8. 1/3 cup salted pistachios, chopped
- 9. 1 green apple, thinly sliced
- Happy the oven to 375°
- In a baking dish, lightly drizzle the beets and thyme with olive oil. Season with salt and pepper. Cover with foil and roast until the beets are tender, about 1 hour and 45 minutes. Let cool, then peel the beets and cut them into 3/4inch dice.
- In a large bowl, whisk the vinegar with the mustard. Whisk in the remaining 1/2 cup of oil until emulsified. Add the horseradish and season with salt and pepper; toss with the beets and pistachios. Transfer the beets to a platter, top with the apple and serve.

rise to top. Add more milk to taste.






11-19-2017 at approximately 7:30 AM, New Castle City Police responded to the **100 block of Lukens Drive** for a

vehicle crash. Officers arrived and discovered that a vehicle left the roadway in the area of the train tracks and struck a railroad crossing sign and a telephone pole. The vehicle was unoccupied and had extensive damage. Officers located a 30 year old male subject in the area and determined that he was operating the vehicle at the time of the crash. The investigation also led the officers to believe that the operator was driving under the influence of **drugs / alcohol.** The operator was charged with Driving Under the Influence,

Driving with a suspended license, No proof of insurance, and other traffic 11-22-17 at approximately 2:15 AM, a New Castle City Police officer and

his canine partner Cooper were on routine patrol in the City New Castle. The officer conducted a vehicle stop in the area of Chestnut Street and East 3rd Street. The officer approached the vehicle and made contact with the operator and immediately detected a strong odor of Marijuana coming from the vehicle. The operator of the vehicle was identified as 20 year old Logan Ribar from the state of Maine. Canine Cooper conducted a search of the vehicle and gave a positive alert on the trunk of the car. Officers recovered 628 grams of Marijuana, drug paraphernalia, and \$1,400.00 from the trunk of the vehicle.

Ribar was charged with Possession With the Intent to Deliver a controlled substance, Possession of Marijuana (other than personal use quantity with an aggravating factor), and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. Ribar was arraigned at JP Court 11 via video phone and committed to HYCl in lieu of \$6.000.00 secured bail.


