

Now it's time for that turkey sandwich, hash or salad. So here's the condiment of the season!

INGREDIENTS

CRANBERRY CHUTNER

1 tbsp olive oil • 1/4 cup finely minced shallot 1 tbsp peeled and finely grated fresh ginger 1 bag (12oz) fresh cranberries, rinsed and picked over

1 cup sugar • 2 tbsps red-wine vinegar Coarse salt and ground pepper

DIRECTIONS

1.In a large saucepan, heat oil over medium-low. Add shallots and ginger; cook, stirring occasionally, until shallots are softened, about 5 minutes.

2.Add cranberries, sugar, vinegar, and 1 cup water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer, stirring often, until most of the berries have burst and mixture has thickened, 10 to 15 minutes.

3.Season with salt and pepper. Let cool completely. Serve at room temperature or chilled.

1.5 cups Fresh Cranberries 1 cup Water .75 cup Sugar

> **PREPARATION** Combine all the ingredients in a small saucepan over medium heat. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to low and simmer until the cranberries start to fall apart, about 10 minutes. Fine-strain into a bowl, discarding the solids, and let cool. Cover, and store in the refrigerator.


