

### ingredients

2 teaspoons vegetable oil 1/2 teaspoon ginger, minced 1 tablespoon garlic, chopped 1/2 cup soy sauce 1/2 cup water 3/4 cup dark brown sugar vegetable oil, for frying (about 1 cup) 1 lb flank steak 1/4 cup cornstarch

2 large green onions

### directions:

Make the sauce by heating 2 tsp of vegetable oil in a medium saucepan over med/low heat. Don't get the oil too hot. Add ginger and garlic to the pan and quickly add the soy sauce and water before the garlic scorches. Dissolve the brown sugar in the sauce, then raise the heat to about medium and boil the sauce for 2-3 minutes or until the sauce thickens. Remove it from the heat.

Slice the flank steak against the grain into 1/4" thick bite-size slices. Tilt the blade of your knife at about a forty five degree angle to the top of the steak so that you get wider cuts.

Dip the steak pieces into the cornstarch to apply a very thin dusting to both sides of each piece of beef

Let the beef sit for about 10 minutes so that the cornstarch sticks.

As the beef sits, heat up one cup of oil in a wok (you may also use a



skillet for this step as long as the beef will be mostly covered with oil). Heat the oil over medium heat until it's nice and hot, but not smoking.

12 Add the beef to the oil and sauté for just two minutes, or until the beef just begins to darken on the edges. You don't need a thorough cooking here since the beef is going to go back on the heat later. Stir the meat around a little so that

it cooks evenly.

After a couple minutes, use a large slotted spoon to take the meat out and onto paper towels, then pour the oil out of the wok or skillet. Put the pan back over the heat, add the water, dump the meat back into it and simmer for one minute.

Add the sauce, cook for one minute while stirring, then add all the green onions.

Cook for one more minute, then remove the beef and onions with tongs or a slotted spoon to a serving plate. Leave the excess sauce behind in the pan.

# Pomegranate White Chocolate Cheesecake

### ingredients

Crust & Filling 14 creme-filled chocolate sandwich cookies (1 1/4 cups finely crushed)

2 pkg (6 oz) white chocolate,

chopped

4 pkg (8 oz each) cream cheese, Softened

1/2 cup sugar ,1/2 tsp Double-Strength Vanilla

4 eggs, room temperature Sauce & Garnish 1 cup (250 mL) 100%

pomegranate juice

1 tbsp cornstarch Sweetened whipped cream, pomegranate seeds and white chocolate curls (optional)

- *directions.* Preheat oven to 325°F (160°F). For crust, lightly spray sides of **Springform Pan** with nonstick cooking spray. Break cookies in half and place in Manual Food Processor; cover and pump handle to form very fine crumbs. Press cookie crumbs evenly over bottom and slightly up sides of pan. Bake 8 minutes. Remove pan from oven to **Stackable Cooling Rack.**
- For filling, place chocolate in microwave safe bowl. Microwave, uncovered, on HIGH 1-1. minutes or until mostly melted, stirring every 30 seconds. Place cream cheese, sugar and vanilla into Stainless (4-qt./4-L) Mixing Bowl; beat on medium speed of electric mixer just until incorporated. Beat in eggs, one at a time, mixing after each addition just until incorporated. Add chocolate; mix just until blended. Pour over crust.
- Bake 55-65 minutes or until center appears nearly set when gently shaken (center will firm as it cools). Turn off oven; open oven door slightly. Let cheesecake stand in oven 1 hour. Remove pan from oven to cooling rack; remove collar from pan. Cover cheesecake; refrigerate 4 hours or overnight.
- For sauce, combine juice and cornstarch in 1.5-qt. saucepan; bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Reduce heat to low and simmer 1-2 minutes or until slightly thickened, stirring frequently. Remove from heat; pour into 2 cup prep bowl. Cover and refrigerate until chilled.
- For each serving, drizzle with syrup and garnish with whipped cream, pomegranate seeds and chocolate curls, if desired.

### ingredients

1/4 cup vodka 1/4 cup Champagne 1/2 cup cranberry juice Crushed ice 2 strips orange zest, each about 1/4-inch wide

and 2 inches long directions

Combine the vodka, Champagne and juice in a largestemmed red wine glass. Add crushed ice and stir until the mixture is well chilled. Twist the orange strips over the glass, drop them in, and serve.

1 1/2 cups orange juice 3 cups burgundy wine or any leftover red wine 3 cups sparkling cider


### directions
