**RK** DRAINAGE + WALKWAY IMPROVEMENTS

At the Trustees monthly meeting, Drew Hayes of ForeSite Associates presented a long awaited plan that that would greatly alleviate the fooding in Battery Park while being a foundation for numerous improvements to follow. Dotted yellow indicates the present drainage lines to remain. The red will be new 36" to 42" diameter pipes. River currents affects the outfall of rain water. (I have added blue current directionals). The outfall at the right (св#6) catches a lot of the debris and is always blocked by sediment. The new outfall (red left) would be swept clean by the rivers currents. Continued on page 4

### you'll need

1 tbsp olive oil • 2 lbs ground beef • 1 lg Vidalia onion, chp'd

- 1 red bell pepper, chp'd
- 4 cloves garlic, chp'd 3 c water
- 1 (29 oz) can tomato sauce 2 (14.5 oz)
- cans roasted tomatoes 2 tsps dried
- basil 2 tsps dried oregano 3 tbsps Hot
- Sauce 1 tsp garlic powder 2 c elbow macaroni kosher salt, black pepper & parsley to taste

# follow Paula's steps

1 Heat oil in a lg Dutch oven over medium high heat. Add the beef, and brown for 10 minutes, breaking up with the back of your wooden spoon as you stir. Add the onion and continue to cook, while stirring, until tender, about 5 minutes.

2 Add all the remaining ingredients, except the macaroni, and cover with a lid, and simmer for 20 minutes.

3 Stir in the macaroni, cover with the lid, and simmer for another 30 minutes.

4 Let mixture stand for 20 minutes before serving. Serve with garlic bread and garnish with fresh parsley.



# Park drainage continued

The study and preparations to-date has been coved by \$35,850 previously allocated. Additional engineering money of \$40,000 was approved to complete phase #1 (red portion). Pending matching grants that amount may be reduced. This initial phase is to be completed by the end of spring 2016.

# NEW wayside exhibits


Many have seen wayside exhibits around town. They're always available to serve visitors and residents alike. The Fort Casimir exhibit should be installed after the holiday season.

# Fort Casimir: Key to the Early Delaware Valley

In the mid-1600s this site was the focal point of a three-nation struggle for control of the Delaware River. Dutch military leaders recognized the strategic importance of this place in 1651 and established a fort here. Swedish settlers from Fort Christina (Wilmington) responded by seizing the fort in 1654 and renaming it Fort Trefaldighet (Fort Trinity). A year later Peter Stuyvesant, the governor of New Netherland, forced the surrender of the fort to the Dutch. The fort remained in Dutch hands until the English assaulted it in 1664. Its capture assured English control of the Delaware Valley.

### Christmas Seals<sup>®</sup> It all began in Delaware

In the early 20th century, tuberculosis was the leading cause of death in the U.S. Physicians were experiencing the first signs of success treating tuberculosis in special hospitals called sanatoriums, and one of those facilities had fallen on tough times. The tiny Delaware sanatorium would have to close its doors if \$300 could not be raised to save it. One of its doctors explained the plight to his cousin, a Red Cross volunteer named Emily Bissell. Bissell was a veteran fundraiser, and she soon came up with a plan based on one that had worked in Denmark: She borrowed money from friends to print the first 50,000 Seals, got permission from the Wilmington postmaster to sell them in the post office lobby, and sold the first Christmas Seal on December 7, 1907.



Emily Bissell designed the first holiday seal in 1907 and sold them at the Wilmington Delaware post office for a penny each.




