

You'll need... 2 cups flour, sifted 1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon vanilla 1 cup honey rainbow sprinkles maraschino cherries





Place flour and salt into a large bowl. Make a well (indentation) in the center of flour and add the eggs one at a time, mixing slightly after each addition. Add the vanilla extract and mix well to make a soft dough. Turn dough on to a lightly floured surface and knead until soft

Divide dough into halves and lightly roll each half 1/4 inch thick to form a rectangle. Cut dough with a pastry knife into strips 1/4" wide. Use the palm of your hand to roll strips to pencil thickness. Cut into pieces about ¼" to ½ long. Heat at least 2" of cooking oil in a pan until it's very hot.

Fry only as many pieces of dough as will float one layer deep for 3 to 5 minutes or until lightly browned, turning occasionally. Drain before removing, and then place on paper towels to absorb the excess oil.

Heat the honey in a microwave until it is hot. Add in the drained fried dough pieces. Stir constantly until all pieces are coated. Remove, form into a wreath and add sprinkles. Place the maraschino cherries around the wreath.





William Penn was the son of Admiral Sir William Penn, so he was brought up in a rich upper class family with close connections to the royal family. Hannah Callowhill was his second wife, and was married when she was 25 and Penn 52. Both were Quakers, but Hannah had an unusual upbringing - she was educated as a business woman! Perhaps because all 8 of her siblings had died in infancy, her father decided to teach her business skills that included accounting and the import and export business. This stood Hannah in good stead. For six years she took over running the official business of Pennsylvania after William had a stroke. After his death, and then for the following 8 years, Hannah became the official Proprietor of Pennsylvania, running the province from her home in England. She died when she was 55








## Copper thief at River Plaza arrested



The New Castle City Police arrested a Collins Park man for the theft of twelve industrial sized air conditioner/heating unit condensers from the rooftop of the River Plaza Shopping Center. On Thurs., Dec 4th 4 M/Sgt. Bernard Torre was preparing to do an interview with Fox News at the River Plaza lot when a vehicle matching the description on the surveillance video rolled up into the lot. John W. Royer III, 43, of the 300 block of McGinn Place was charged with Felony Theft and Criminal Mischief. "The timing of this

could not have been any more perfect, and the fact that Royer actually pulled in to the scene of the crime while police and a News van were in the lot preparing to do a story is simply amazing".
