# Episcopo wins run-off

Since there wasn't a majority winner (a total of 50% of the vote plus one) in the October 19<sup>th</sup> **Trustees of New Castle Common** Election a runoff election was scheduled for Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup> between the top two contenders Thomas A. Episcopo and James A. Whisman, Jr.

Saturday 570 votes were cast (53 absentee) between 10am and 6pm. Episcopo garnered 350 votes to Whisman's 220.

Earlier in the campaign Episcopo said "he's eager to seek the opportunity to serve as a Trustee of New Castle Common".

The Trustees were established by the Penn family in 1764, prior to the existence of the U.S. The Trustees of New Castle Common are a most unusual organization. They are unique within the State of Delaware, and perhaps among these United States. The Trustees have a history as old as New Castle because the common land has existed as such since the days of early Dutch colonization when New Castle was Fort Casimir in 1651. Now more than 200 years later, this body of 13 Trustees oversee a nonprofit charitable organization founded by William Penn, which was incorporated in 1764 and reincorporated by assembly in 1792. The Trustees purpose is to benefit the citizens, to preserve the historical City of New Castle and the remaining lands and open space now held in trust. Its income is

derived primarily from property rentals and investments.

#### English Christmas Punch is a warm punch that is perfect

for holiday parties. The rum and red wine are paired

with a tea of your choice, though I would suggest something universal like a green or Earl Grey teas. An orange-based tea would work nicely as well.

There are two methods you can use to make this punch, one simply warms everything together and the other involves a little showmanship by lighting a sugar-filled ladle of rum and pouring it into the punch.

Let's stay with the safer...no flame method.

Make sure that both your punchbowl and glasses are suitable for warm drinks. As with any drink that is flamed, caution should be taken when making igniting the ladle.

#### Gotta get

- \* 750 ml bottle dark rum 750 ml bottle dry red wine
- \* 3 cups strong, brewed tea 2 cups sugar
- \* 1/2 cup orange juice 1/2 cup lemon juice
- \* Season fruits for garnish

#### Here's how

- 1. Heat, but do not allow to boil, the all of the ingredients in a saucepan or chafing dish.
- 2. Stir well, ensuring all of the sugar is dissolved.
- 3. Pour the heated mix into a heat-proof punch bowl and add seasonal fruits like orange slices and cranberries.

200ml (about 7 oz) good quality vodka


- \*Carefully, slit the vanilla pods open with a sharp knife.




