

# DINER english rib roast

1/3 cup finely ground coffee 2 tablespoons kosher salt

tablespoons roshly ground black pepper

(5 bones)

1/4 vanilla bean, split and seeds scraped 1 12lb bone-in prime rib roast

1 In a bowl, thoroughly blend the coffee with the salt, pepper and vanilla bean seeds. Set the rib roast in a roasting pan and rub it all over with the coffee mixture, concentrating most of the rub on the fatty part of the meat. Turn the roast bone side down and let stand at room temperature for 30 minutes.

- 2 Preheat the oven to 450°. Roast the meat for 15 minutes. Reduce the oven temperature to 325° and roast for about 2 1/2 hours longer, until an instant-read thermometer inserted in the thickest part of the meat registers 125° for medium-rare.
- 3 Transfer the roast to a carving board and let rest for 20 minutes. Scrape off any excess coffee rub. Carve the meat in 1/2-inch-thick slices and serve.

The coffee-rubbed roast can be refrigerated overnight. Bring to room temperature before roasting.





THE TREE

**Council President Linda Ratchford** has been following and researching some of the resident concerns regarding the City Christmas tree in Dewey Park. Her findings include:

- Designated tree has large gaps between limbs limiting amount of light string coverage
- Squirrels chewed some of the wires last year causing some failures
- Warm white large LED bulbs have been used for several years.
- There is some slight variation in light intensity depending on which side of the bulb faces

**Now:** City and MSC will add more light strings and work to improve the installation on the same tree in the same location.

The City has historically focused on white lights on light poles and living trees to highlight our beauty and not take away from the natural wreaths, garlands, green space and architecture--some of the things that make us so special. City annually invests several thousand dollars to support the holidays--contributions to Arasapha Garden Club for the greenery, miscellaneous supplies such as lights and labor-intensive work to hang wreaths, etc.

Other cities take different approaches and spend much more. We always appreciate feedback and try to improve each year. We can certainly re-evaluate our approach in the future but we would need to gather more input, plan carefully and budget accordingly.
