- 10** Civil engineer **Robert Thompson** patented the first pneumatic tires. 1845, **Wyoming**, allowed women to vote and hold office 1869, **Levant Richardson** patents ball-bearing skate. 1884, **Fats Domino** recorded his first sides for Imperial Records. 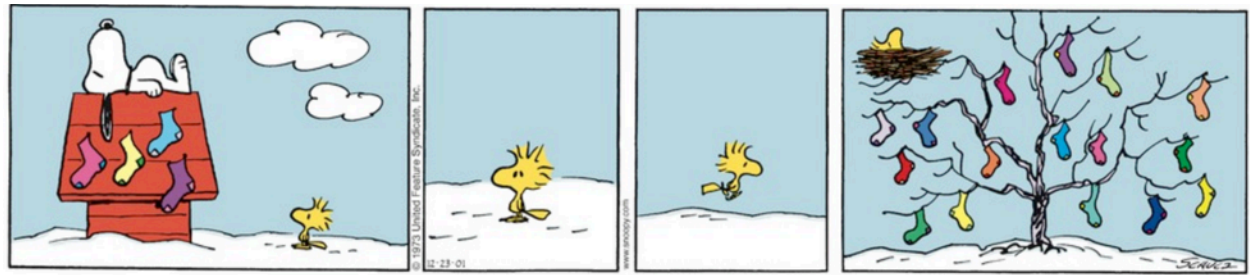

 english rib roast



1 rib roast (7 to 8 lb), with 3 to 4 ribs trimmed - 2 tsp dry mustard - 2 tsp sugar - 2 tsp Dijon mustard - Coarse salt and freshly ground pepper - 2 tbsp all-purpose flour - 2 cups beef stock - Roasted Potatoes - 2 lb cooked brussels sprouts, for serving - Horseradish Sauce

- 1 Remove any excess fat from the roast, leaving a thin layer. In a small bowl, combine dry mustard, sugar, and Dijon mustard. Brush mixture over the fat and cut surfaces of the roast. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours or up to overnight.
- 2 Oven happt at 450°. Set the roast, rib-side down, in a heavy, shallow roasting pan. (*The ribs act as a natural rack.*) Using a paring knife, score the fat. Season with salt and pepper. Roast for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 350° and continue to roast, basting every 15 minutes, until it reaches a temperature of 125° for medium rare on an instant-read thermometer. Remove roast to a platter. Let rest for 15 minutes before carving.
- 3 Pour off all but 2 tbsp of fat from the roasting pan. Set pan on stove over medium heat. Simmer until juices begin to darken, 1 to 2 minutes. Whisk in flour and cook, scraping up caramelized bits, until flour is deep golden brown, about 3 minutes. Add stock and bring to a boil, stirring until thickened. It should very lightly coat the back of a spoon. Season with salt and pepper. Strain gravy and serve with potatoes, brussels sprouts, and horseradish sauce

It all began in Delaware

In the early 20th century, tuberculosis was the leading cause of death in the U.S. Physicians were experiencing the first signs of success treating tuberculosis in special hospitals called sanatoriums, and one of those facilities had fallen on tough times. The tiny Delaware sanatorium would have to close its doors if \$300 could not be raised to save it. One of its doctors explained the plight to his cousin, a Red Cross volunteer named Emily Bissell. Bissell was a veteran fundraiser, and she soon came up with a plan based on one that had worked in Denmark: She borrowed money from friends to print the first 50,000 Seals, got permission from the Wilmington postmaster to sell them in the post office lobby, and sold the first Christmas Seal on **December 7, 1907.**

Emily Bissell designed the first holiday seal in 1907 and sold them at the Wilmington Delaware post office for a penny each.

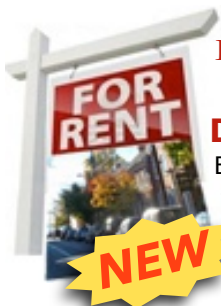

Last week in 1933, we ratified the 21st amendment, which repealed the 18th Amendment, thus ending prohibition. Here's bit'o trivia!

Prohibition was the result of the ratification of the 18th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which prohibited the production, sale, and transport of alcohol for mass consumption. It actually wasn't illegal to drink alcohol; you just couldn't set up a brewery and sell to the masses, nor could you open a bar where crowds could imbibe.

The vote on the 21st Amendment is typically seen as the end of Prohibition, but an act passed earlier in 1933 allowed people to have wine and beer with a low alcohol content of 3.2 percent. The Cullen-Harrison Act, signed in April, made those two types of alcohol legal again to the relief of those who were tired of the no-alcohol beer that was previously the only legal version available. Given that President Franklin Roosevelt had won the election with the support of those who wanted to end Prohibition, the passing of the Cullen-Harrison Act was an obvious sign that things would soon change for those who wanted to drink. There was probably no one happier about the 21st Amendment than the beer makers. And August Busch (the guy who started the Budweiser beer company) was just one of many in a good mood. His kids decided to honor the big day by giving him a six-horse Clydesdale hitch.

Whether it was such a high priority because it got alcohol businesses back to work and tax revenue back in the government's coffers amidst the Great Depression (as FDR said) or because Roosevelt (known to enjoy a drink as much as the next guy) just wanted people to be able to throw back a brew is something we'll let you debate. Either way, it didn't matter. The 21st Amendment was over and as Roosevelt himself put it, *"What America needs now is a drink."*

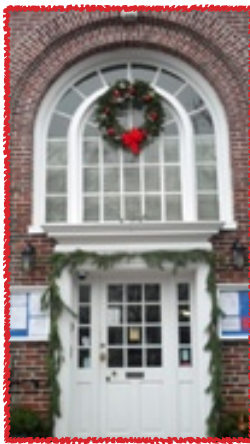
