HISTORY

- **11** Venetian blinds were patented in England by Edward Beran. 1769, Dr. Horace Wells became the first person to have a tooth extracted after receiving an anesthetic for the dental procedure. 1844, The first American playhouse lit exclusively by electricity, Boston's Bijou opened 1882, ◆The Chesterfield Supper Club debuted on NBC radio. Perry Como, Jo Stafford and many other stars of the day shared the spotlight. 1944, Karen and Richard Carpenter received a gold record for their single, ◆ Top of the World. 1973
- **12** Ludwig van Beethoven receives first lesson from Franz Joseph Haydn. 1792, 70 years after Washington DC was established as the nations capital Joseph Rainey of SC became the first black lawmaker to be sworn into the US House of Representatives. 1870, The comic strip The Katzenjammer Kids appeared for the first time. 1897, The first all-metal aircraft, the German Junkers J1, made its first flight. 1915, At 22 years and 104 days of age, Bruce McLaren became the youngest driver to win a Grand Prix race. 1959, Mr. Lonely by Bobby Vinton topped the charts. 1964, Armand Hammer bought a notebook of writings by Leonardo da Vinci for \$5.28 million at auction in London.
- **13** The *US National Guard* was created when militia regiments were organized by the General Court of the Massachusetts Bay Colony. 1636, *John Adamson* received a patent for a dry dock. 1816, an estimated 11,000 Northern

- soldiers were killed or wounded when Union forces were defeated by Confederates under General Robert E. Lee, at the *Battle of Fredericksburg*. 1862, The *Clip-on tie* is created. 1928, 1929 *Hoagy Carmichael* recorded with *Louis Armstrong* Rockin' Chair on Columbia Records and cylinders. *Grandma Moses* (*Anna Mary Robertson Moses*) died at the age of 101. 1961
- **14** Artificial pearls first manufactured. 1656, David Wilkinson patented the nut and bolt machine. 1789, George Washington, died at the age 67. 1799, Max Planck of Berlin University revealed his revolutionary Quantum Theory. 1900, Fanny Brice, recorded If You Want the Rainbow You Must Have the Rain, 1928, Sandy Koufax, age 19, was signed by the Brooklyn Dodgers. 1953
- **15** The *Bill of Rights* are enacted, amending the US Constitution. 1791, *Jane Austen's Emma* was published. 1815, In Philadelphia, the *first street cleaning machine* was put into use. 1854, Chief *Sitting Bull* was killed by Indian police. 1890, *Gone With the Wind* premiered in where else but Atlanta, Georgia. 1939, *Dr. R. Townley Paton* and a small group of doctors laid the groundwork for the Eye-Bank for Sight Restoration. 1944, the same year *Glenn Miller* died in a plane crash over the English Channel, *Vaughn Meader's* ◆ The first Family_album goes #1. 1962
- **16** Nearly 350 chests of tea were dumped into Boston Harbor off of British ships by Colonial patriots. 1773, The Tale of Peter Rabbit, by Beatrix Potter, was printed for the first time. 1901, Albert Einstein publishes his General Theory of Relativity 1915, Nylon yarn was sold to hosiery

mills to make women's stockings. And it all started in nylon's hometown-Wilmington, Delaware. 1939, World War II Battle of the Bulge began. 1944, The Lemon Pipers released & Green Tambourine 1967



Slow Cooked Beef Ragu



A slow cooked gluten free beef ragu recipe has a ton of flavor with only a few, simple ingredients, perfect served with pasta or polenta!

ingredients

1 large onion (sliced) • 4 garlic cloves • 2 tbsp fresh rosemary (chopped) • 2 lb beef chuck roast • 1 tsp kosher salt • 1 tsp black pepper • 2 cups beef broth • ¹/₄ cup red wine • 1 can (6 oz) tomato paste • 1 can (15 oz) diced tomatoes • 12 ozs Pappardelle Pasta or cheesy polenta (dick for homemade recipe) • ¹/₂ cup Parmesan cheese (grated)

instructions

Add onion and garlic cloves to the bottom of a slow cooker and set to high.

Sprinkle the fresh rosemary over the top. Season the beef with the salt and pepper, then add to the slow cooker.

In a medium bowl, combine the beef broth, red wine and tomato paste.

Pour the mixture over the beef.
Add the can of diced tomatoes to the crock pot.
Cook on high for 6-8 hours.

Reach a fork into the crock pot and the beef pulls right apart.

Serve it on top of creamy polenta or tossed with pappardelle pasta. Use a ladle to pour the sauce from the crock pot over the beef and polenta or pasta. Top with fresh grated parmesan cheese.

The Trustees of New Castle Common annually award grants to community organizations and scholarships to eligible residents of the City of New Castle.

Application forms for this year's grants and scholarships are available on the Trustee's web site: http://trusteesncc.org or from the Trustees' office.

Last year the Trustees budgeted \$75,000 for scholarships and more than \$200,000 for community grants.

ONLINE Shopping ALERT

If you're one of the millions of online shoppers this holiday

season, you need to be aware of a dangerous scam that's catching people off guard.
This one targets Amazon shoppers.
A recent report shows that scammers have sent thousands of emails to customers that 'appear' to be from Amazon, claiming there's a problem with their order.

It asks for the customer to confirm certain information by clicking a link provided in the email.

The link takes them to a fake website that appears to be legit, giving thieves the chance to trick shoppers into handing over personal information.

Here's some reminder tips to help protect you from online scammers:

- Be wary of emails containing links or attachments.
- Call the company directly to find out if there's information you need to know.
- Secure, real websites will have 'https' at the beginning. The 's' indicates secure.

Amazon says it has a **'contact us'** button on its site and if you have concerns, you should contact them there.



The Holly Capitol of the World... Sussex County Delaware!

They were shipped from Milton, Bridgeville, Millsboro, and Selbyville to New York City, Philadelphia, and as far away as Hawaii. Nearly 4,000 workers made the holly wreaths which brought 3 to 6 cents each. The Christmas wreath has come to convey its own set of

meanings in modern times. Across time, the circle or ring shape of a wreath that has no beginning and no end symbolizes eternity or eternal rebirth. Pre-Christian cultures' interpretation of the power of evergreens to battle the forces of winter has evolved into a modern representation of eternal life. The vast array of materials that are used to create modern wreath carry significance as well. Holly represents immortality, for instance, whereas cedar stands for strength. But for many, the wreath's symbolic attributes are much simpler than all this. The Christmas wreath has evolved into a sign of welcoming


and an acknowledgment of holiday cheer for this season that emphasizes generosity, giving, and the gathering of loved ones.


