



- 1 In a bowl, thoroughly blend the coffee with the salt, pepper and vanilla bean seeds. Set the rib roast in a roasting pan and rub it all over with the coffee mixture, concentrating most of the rub on the fatty part of the meat. Turn the roast bone side down and let stand at room temperature for 30 minutes.
- 2 Preheat the oven to 450°. Roast the meat for 15 minutes. Reduce the oven temperature to 325° and roast for about 2 1/2 hours longer, until an instant-read thermometer inserted in the thickest part of the meat registers 125° for medium-rare.
- 3 Transfer the roast to a carving board and let rest for 20 minutes. Scrape off any excess coffee rub. Carve the meat in 1/2-inch-thick slices and serve.

The coffee-rubbed roast can be refrigerated overnight. Bring to room temperature before roasting.

1pt heavy cream • 8oz bourbon • 4oz Spiced rum

garnish: 1 grated nutmeg let's do it!

In a large bowl, beat together the egg yolks and half a cup of sugar until they turn light in color.

Stir in the milk, heavy cream, bourbon and rum. In a separate bowl, beat the egg whites with the remaining quartercup of sugar until they form soft peaks.

Fold about a third of the egg whites into the volk mixture. Serve in punch or tea cups topped with freshly grated nutmeg, folding in more of the egg whites as desired.

Sure that's why you always started asking about gift ideas in the summer and why you usually talked Dad into spending more on us kids than he had planned.

Brother and his family were at the house last weekend. We did the traditional stuff, emptying the faded old Christmas stockings of their toothbrushes, miniature chocolates, aftershave lotion, gag gifts and

Watching the colorful squad of plastic Donald Ducks, Goofys and Santas assemble along the coffee table brought a cold tightness to my stomach. These Pez dispensers weren't the same as the ones you stuffed in the stocking dozens of Christmases before. These weren't from you. You wouldn't have left them in their plastic packages. That's just not the way you did the stocking.

It all happened so fast, you know. In April you were sick. In July you were gone. In December I was an adult orphan trying clumsily to empty a Christmas stocking that only you had ever before stuffed. There was no longer a reason to feign interest in the spring-loaded coin holder I would never use, or the Elvis key chain. Just kidding. Things were missing from the stocking this year. The ballpoint pens. The money clip. The pocket-size tick-tack-toe game. I often wondered where you found all those doodads. But I never had to wonder if Brother had the same number of them in his stocking. I may be the oldest, but at Christmas time we were always equal. Remember'? The eggnog was good. We had the ham dinner, and as usual your daughter-in-law outdid herself. There were great desserts.

The Dallas Cowboys didn't play. Neither did Penn State because they're going to the Orange Bowl. But you would have found some team for the day and enjoyed the game, as long as your guys won.

It all began winding down around midnight. The little kids were in bed asleep. The big kids were nodding off.

The next morning we drove to the cemetery. Everything looks fine. The wreath is a brilliant green with large red ribbons. Nothing fancy, you always said.

This weekend we'll exchange some gifts with the in-laws. We'll be back by early afternoon. No real plans. No phone call this year. Maybe I'll look at some snapshots of last year's Christmas. No, never mind.

Well, gotta go. You take care now.

And Mom, Merry Christmas.

Last week in 1933, we ratified the 21st amendment, which repealed the 18th Amendment, thus ending prohibition.

Here's a bit'o trivia!

Prohibition was the result of the ratification of the 18th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which prohibited the production, sale, and transport of alcohol for mass consumption. It actually wasn't illegal to drink alcohol; you just couldn't set up a brewery and sell to the masses, nor could you open a bar where crowds could imbibe.

The vote on the 21st Amendment is typically seen as the end of Prohibition, but an act passed earlier in 1933 allowed people to have wine and beer with a low alcohol content of 3.2 percent. The Cullen-Harrison Act, signed in April, made those two types of alcohol legal again to the relief of those who were tired of the noalcohol beer that was previously the only legal version available. Given that President Franklin Roosevelt had won the election with the support of those who wanted to end Prohibition, the passing of the Cullen-Harrison Act was an obvious sign that things would soon change for those who wanted to drink. There was probably no one happier about the 21st Amendment than the beer makers. August Busch (the guy who started the Budweiser beer company) was just one of many in a good mood. His kids decided to honor the big day by giving him a six-horse Clydesdale hitch.

Whether it was such a high priority because it got alcohol businesses back to work and tax revenue back in the government's coffers amidst the Great Depression (as FDR said) or because

Roosevelt (known to enjoy a drink as much as the next guy) just wanted people to able to throw back a brew is something we'll let you debate. Either way, it didn't matter. The 21st Amendment was over and as Roosevelt himself put it, "What America needs now is a drink."

In the early 20th century, tuberculosis was the leading cause of death in the U.S. Physicians were experiencing the first signs of success treating tuberculosis in special hospitals called sanatoriums, and one of those facilities had fallen on tough times. The tiny Delaware sanatorium would have to close its doors if \$300 could not be raised to save it. One of its doctors explained the plight to his cousin, a Red Cross volunteer named Emily Bissell. Bissell was a veteran fundraiser, and she soon came up with a plan based on one that had worked in Denmark: She borrowed money from friends to print the first 50,000 Seals, got permission from the Wilmington postmaster to sell them in the post office lobby, and sold the first Christmas Seal on December 7, 1907.
